ORDER VACATING GENERAL ORDER 00-05 AND ORDER EFFECTUATING A REVISED ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER ESTABLISHING AN IN-STATE TRAVEL REIMBURSEMENT POLICY FOR THE JUDICIAL BRANCH OF STATE GOVERNMENT

This matter came before the Court by direction of the Board of Judicial Policy and Administration to establish in-state per diem rates, as well as travel mileage, for judicial officers and staff of the judicial branch. The Board recommended that the policy adopted in General Order 00-05 be vacated, and that the policy set out below be adopted in its place. Effective immediately upon the entry of this order: (1) For in-state travel, judicial officers and judicial branch employees shall be reimbursed for actual expenses, not to exceed \$85.00, for all locations within the State of Wyoming, except Teton and Park Counties. For Teton and Park Counties, prudent actual expenses are authorized. Receipts required by statute must be provided. See Wyo. Stat. Ann. § 9-3-102(d)(i). Judicial officers and judicial branch employees also have the option to travel at the standard state per diem rate (see Wyo. Stat. Ann. § 9-3-102(a)). (2) The mileage reimbursement for judicial officers and staff of the judicial branch shall be set at \$.325 per mile. See Wyo. STAT. § 9-3-103(a)(iii)(A), and INTERNAL REVENUE BULLETIN, Rev. Proc. 99-38, October 25, 1999. It is therefore,

ORDERED that effective upon the date of entry of this order: General Order 00-05 is vacated; and the in-state travel reimbursement policy set out more fully above, is adopted.
