ORDER SUSPENDING CANON 3(7), CODE OF JUDICIAL CONDUCT,
FOR A LIMITED PURPOSE

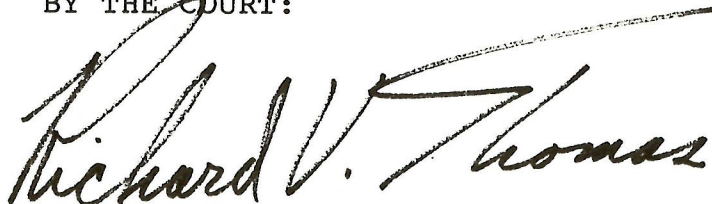
Upon the recommendation of the district court, after consideration and on a trial basis, it is

ORDERED that the provisions of Canon 3(7) of the Code of Judicial Conduct be, and they hereby are, suspended for purposes of a hearing set for 8:00 a.m. on September 29, 1984, in the District Court of the Sixth Judicial District of the State of Wyoming in and for Campbell County, in the case styled Bill L. Barkley v. Campbell County Canvassing Board, et al.; and it further is

ORDERED that televising, radio broadcasting, recording and taking photographs for news coverage for immediate release be and is permissible for purposes of this case only, and the use of any additional lighting (including flash); the placing of equipment so as not to be intrusive upon the court proceedings; the movement or removal of any equipment; and the movement of any camera or equipment operators and photographers shall be subject to the direction of the district court.
