WJC BUSINESS

Welcome

Chief Justice Fox welcomed the members of the Judicial Council and reported that a lot has been accomplished over the past year, thanks to the hard work of the Judicial Branch Innovation task force (JBI). One year ago, the Judicial Council adopted a strategic plan, and many of the projects launched then are now being implemented. One of the most significant accomplishments was getting employee pay raises and classifying all employees into a uniform pay scale. This will enable the Judicial Branch to take the results of the classification to the legislature for future raises. Judge Wilking, who was instrumental in the JBI and a real force on the Judicial Council, is no longer with the Judicial Council. She passed the baton on to Judge Snyder, who was welcomed by Chief Justice Fox and thanked for coming on board.

Case Report

Angie Dorsch expressed her gratitude to the Council for inviting her to the meeting and provided an update on the work of Equal Justice Wyoming. The organization is funded through the Civil Legal Services Account, which was established by the legislature in 2010. The funds are used to provide civil legal services to individuals whose income is below 200% of the federal poverty level. The program aims to aid the court system by assisting court users. It provides help to individuals who are either visiting the court or trying to determine whether their case is appropriate to proceed to court. Many people who avail themselves of this program's services do not need to go through the court system as they can resolve their issues or understand their rights and may even realize that their problem is not a legal one that requires court intervention.

Angie Dorsch provided the Council with an overview of all the services that Equal Justice Wyoming provides. The court navigator program is a high priority for the Judicial Branch. Equal Justice Wyoming has handouts and resources that could be used by the navigators. They can review those resources to see if there are gaps or if they need to be redesigned to be more helpful. Equal Justice Wyoming has received ARPA funding from the legislature to go towards technology upgrades, which would include a website redesign and triage tool that could be leveraged by the court

	<p>navigators or as a good resource as a virtual self-help center.</p> <p>Justice Boomgaarden thanked Ms. Dorsch for her report and mentioned that the Branch's access to justice initiatives are much broader than the statutory limitations that Equal Justice Wyoming functions under.</p> <p>Judge Bartlett asked about the timeline for the website redesign. Elisa Butler addressed the question and explained that the Equal Justice Wyoming website has been hosted offsite, so it was not under the Judicial Branch website. To assist in providing better support to EJW, that has recently changed. The EJW website is now under the Judicial Branch domain, and the AOC is looking at a site-wide redesign that would include Equal Justice Wyoming. The RFP for the website redesign will go out early in 2024, and the hope is that the redesign will be completed by the end of 2024.</p> <p>Chief Justice Fox expressed her gratitude to Angie Dorsch for her hard work and for attending the meeting.</p>

The Council members discussed the survey results and proposed some recommendations for the future. Judge Prokos suggested that all courts should have annual security training in their courts. Another suggestion was to turn the survey results over to the Court Security Commission for analysis and to proceed with a plan for the courts. Judge Prokos moved to turn the results over to the Court Security Commission with the recommendation that all courts receive annual security training. Justice Boomgaarden seconded the motion and Chief Justice Fox called for a vote. All Council members voted in favor of the motion with none opposed.</p>
<p>Grant Discussion</p>	<p>Elisa Butler provided an update on the grant applications submitted to the State Justice Institute (SJI). The Judicial Council approved moving forward with three separate grant requests, but SJI suggested that the Wyoming Judicial Branch not submit all grant requests during the same grant period.</p> <p>The court navigator grant application was submitted on August 1st. SJI has not yet decided on that grant. The next grant period for the diversion project pilot in Gillette will be on November 1st, and we have reached out to the National Center for State Courts (NCSC) to work on the grant application for that project.</p> <p>The third grant approved by the Judicial Council is the court security audit, which will involve bringing in NCSC to conduct audits on each of the</p>

	<p>courthouses and provide feedback on where the security gaps lie. The Judiciary will be applying for this grant on or before March 1st and working with NCSC to submit a grant application.</p> <p>There are many additional grant opportunities for the Branch, but the AOC currently lacks personnel to manage some of the larger grants. A grant writer/manager could assist with those kinds of tasks.</p>
<p>Legislative Reports</p> <p>Attachment K – 2022 Wyoming Judicial Council Report</p> <p>Attachment L – Proposed 2023 Wyoming Judicial Council Report</p> <p>The Wyoming Judicial Council approved submission of the proposed 2023 Wyoming Judicial Council Report, with some edits, to the JAC and JJC.</p> <p>Attachment M – 2022 eFiling Report</p> <p>Attachment N – Proposed 2023 eFiling Report</p> <p>The Wyoming Judicial Council approved submission of the proposed 2023 eFiling Report to the Legislature.</p>	<p>Historically, the BJPA provided an annual report to the Wyoming Legislature through the Joint Appropriations Committee and the Joint Judiciary Committee. This reporting fell off for many years but was revived during the 2023 session. A proposed draft report was presented to the Council. Judge Prokos moved to approve the proposed report, with minor edits, to the JAC and JJC. Justice Boomgaarden seconded the motion, and all members voted in favor with none opposed.</p> <p>The Wyoming Judicial Council also discussed the eFiling report and Judge Bluemel moved to submit the report to the Legislature. Judge Prokos seconded the motion and there was no further discussion. All members voted in favor with none opposed.</p>
<p>Supervising Judge</p> <p>The Wyoming Judicial Council approved Judge Prokos as the supervising Judge in Sweetwater County.</p> <p>The Wyoming Judicial Council approved Judge Hibben as the supervising Judge in 2024 in Platte and Niobrara Counties.</p>	<p>Judge Prokos made a motion to approve the supervising Judge switch in Sweetwater County, Judge Bartlett seconded, and all members voted in favor with none opposed.</p> <p>Judge Hibben made a motion to approve a change in the supervising Judge in Platte and Niobrara counties beginning in 2024, Judge Prokos seconded the motion, and all members voted in favor none opposed.</p>
<p>Court Records Division of the Permanent Rules Advisory Committee Update</p> <p>Attachment Q – Revised Rules Governing Access to Court Records</p>	<p>Elisa Butler explained that in 2019, a project was initiated to update the rules that govern access to court records. With the shift towards eFiling and remote public access, it has become even more important for attorneys to have a clear understanding of these rules. The project started with a matrix and a new Permanent Rules Advisory Committee called the Court Records Division was established by the Supreme Court. This committee was tasked with updating the rules governing access to court records.</p> <p>One of the consistent feedback items from both clerks and attorneys was that they were uncertain about which documents were confidential and which ones were sealed. This was mostly due to the statutes that were not entirely clear, and they used language interchangeably. For example, they used "confidential" where they could have meant "sealed" and "sealed" where it could have been "confidential." To address this, the Court Records Division went through all the statutes and determined the level of confidentiality required for each document.</p>

	<p>The matrix developed by the committee goes through each of those statutes and defines the user groups and access level for each document type and the timing of the case. Adoptions serve as a good example of this because as the case progresses, the level of confidentiality changes. Over the last six to eight months, the committee has been updating the language of the rules. One of the decisions the committee made was to merge the rules governing access to court records with the rules governing redactions from court records. This was done to avoid having two separate rules.</p>
<p>Operational Plan Update</p> <p>Attachment R – Operational Plan</p> <p>The Wyoming Judicial Council approved the changes to the Operational Plan.</p>	<p>Elisa Butler provided an update on the Operational Plan, including its progress and some recent changes. The JBI had recommended some changes at their last meeting. To align with the Strategic Plan, some new items were added, such as establishing a pilot diversion program in Campbell County and transitioning Treatment Courts from the Department of Health to the Judicial Branch. There were also some changes to deadlines in the plan. Judge Bartlett made a motion to approve the discussed changes, Judge Prokos seconded the motion, and all members voted in favor with none opposed.</p>
WJC COMMITTEES	
JBI	<p>Chief Justice Fox provided an update on the JBI, stating that it will expire at the end of this year. In December, JBI will submit a report to the WJC from its second year. As the JBI is being phased out, the WJC will take on some of its roles, and Council members need to consider ways to make the transition successful. During the meeting, Council members discussed several ideas, such as seeking more input from different conferences on the WJC agenda, making materials, agenda, and minutes available on a website for review, and redesigning the website to have a page for judge access only. Judge Hibben also suggested that the WJC should make a plan for when the deadlines and goals of the strategic and operational plans expire. Judge Bartlett suggested that the Council should meet at least once a year in person to discuss the strategic plan and goals.</p> <p>Chief Justice Fox also discussed the listening sessions held in August with about ten different agency heads, where the consensus was that they were happy to have the opportunity to talk to the Judicial Branch and provide their feedback and would welcome the opportunity to talk with the Judiciary on an annual basis.</p>
Access to Justice	<p>Justice Boomgaarden provided an update on the Access to Justice Commission. She informed the Wyoming Judicial Council that the commission is presently working on a year-end report that will be presented to WJC in December. The commission is considering the Equal Justice Wyoming rules and aligning them with the Branche's access to justice initiatives.</p>
<p>Human Resources</p> <p>The Wyoming Judicial Council approved authorizing the HR Committee to refine the pay tables to use for long-term application for employee compensation.</p>	<p>Chief Justice Fox provided an update on the Human Resources Committee's progress. The committee has developed new pay tables for the most recent pay increases and is seeking approval from the WJC to move forward with them. Additionally, the HR Committee plans to address questions that arose with the recent raises, such as how employees can move up in their classifications. Judge Hibben moved to approve the HR committee's work</p>

	on refining the pay tables, and Judge Bluemel seconded the motion. All members voted in favor with none opposed.
Forms Attachment S – Forms Committee Purpose and Structure The Wyoming Judicial Council adopted the purpose and structure statement of the Forms Committee.	Elisa Butler gave an update to the Wyoming Judicial Council on the Forms Committee, which was approved as a committee by the WJC during its last meeting. The Forms Committee had its first meeting in August and created a document outlining the committee's purpose and structure. The committee's first goal is to create forms for the court navigator program. The Forms Committee requested approval of its purpose and structure document from the WJC. Justice Boomgaarden moved to approve the document, and Judge Bartlett seconded the motion. There was no discussion, and all members voted in favor of the approval with none opposed.
Audit The Wyoming Judicial Council approved ratification of the decision by the Executive Committee to make the Audit Committee and committee of the WJC. Attachment T – Audit Committee Purpose and Structure The Wyoming Judicial Council approved adopting the purpose and structure statement of the Audit Committee.	During a meeting, Elisa Butler explained that the purpose of the Audit Committee is to audit the circuit courts across the state. The administrative office has audit authority over the circuit courts to ensure that the money that runs through the courts is managed appropriately. The Audit Committee was also formed to look at other areas of the courts and perform micro-audits of court processes. During one of its weekly meetings, the Executive Committee decided to make the Audit Committee a committee of the WJC. Judge Prokos moved to ratify the decision of the Executive Committee to make the Audit Committee a committee of the WJC, and Justice Boomgaarden seconded the motion. The members voted in favor of the motion with none opposed. Justice Boomgaarden then moved to adopt the purpose and structure statement of the Audit Committee, and Judge Bartlett seconded the motion. There was no discussion, and all members voted in favor of the motion with none opposed.
Legislative Relations Attachment U – Proposed Talking Points The Wyoming Judicial Council approved the proposed talking points. Attachment V – Draft Policy	The Legislative Relations Committee has approved talking points, which have been sent out by the Executive Committee. However, the Judicial Council still needs to ratify this decision. Judge Prokos made a motion to ratify the Executive Committee's decision to distribute the talking points, which was seconded by Judge Bluemel. There was no discussion on the matter, and all members voted in favor with none opposed. The Legislative Relations Committee will distribute the list of legislators and their contacts to their respective conferences. This will enable judges and justices to review and initiate conversations with their respective legislators. During the WJC meeting, members discussed a proposed draft policy on judicial officers and AOC staff sitting on legislative committees. The members ultimately decided to table the issue until the December meeting and not take a vote on it during this meeting to give members time to discuss this issue with their conferences.
Technology Attachment W – Private PASS Proposal The Wyoming Judicial Council approved	Justice Boomgaarden provided an update on the Technology Committee's work. The committee meets monthly to discuss the strategic plan and address all strategic initiatives related to technology. The committee is currently focused on improving the reports available to judges for managing their dockets using technology. Additionally, the committee is working on


<p>the Private PASS Proposal.</p> <p>Attachment X – Hardware/Software Standard</p> <p>The Wyoming Judicial Council approved adopting the Hardware/Software Policy.</p>	<p>developing uniform standards for cybersecurity and technology, while also considering data access management and governance policies. The committee is also budgeting for technology expenses for the next ten years and has created a schedule for refreshing the courtroom technology in the state. In 2024, three courtrooms will receive a complete technology refresh, and the equipment taken out will be available for future replacement needs. Starting in 2025, the budget will allow for the complete refresh of seven courtrooms every year, ensuring that each courtroom receives new technology every ten years.</p> <p>Justice Boomgaarden stated that the Private PASS Proposal had been circulated about three times with representatives on the Technology Committee, and this is the final proposed draft. Justice Boomgaarden moved to approve the Private PASS Proposal, Judge Hibben seconded the motion to approve. The Council discussed the proposal and there was some discomfort among the members that district court chambers staff does not have full access to documents in district courts statewide. The Council discussed the fact that district court judges fill in for other judges statewide regularly, and their staff need access to all document, including confidential documents to manage those cases. Justice Boomgaarden explained that if full access is needed in a different court for a judge’s staff, that can be managed by the Applications Team, and that the clerks of district court have requested that this access remain limited unless there is a need for chambers’ staff to access full documents. It is also best practice to limit access to what is absolutely needed. The Council members discussed the fact that this could be revisited at a later date if it becomes problematic. Following discussion Chief Justice Fox called for a vote to approve the proposal. All members voted in favor of the proposal with none opposed.</p> <p>The Wyoming Judicial Council discussed the Hardware and Software Policy. Justice Boomgaarden made a motion to approve the policy, which was seconded by Judge Bluemel. The Council members discussed the policy but did not suggest any modifications. After the discussion, Chief Justice Fox called for a vote, and all members voted in favor of the policy with none opposed.</p>
For the Good of the Order	Chief Justice Fox provided an update on the Chancery Court, noting a significant increase in filings - 23 cases in 2023 compared to 12 in 2022.
Adjourn	Chief Justice Fox thanked the Council members for attending and adjourned the meeting at 10:41 a.m.

Message from the Executive Director



As always, we thank all of our volunteers and pro bono attorneys, legal aid staff, VISTA members, and all of the individuals who make this important work possible. FY 2023 was the first year that Equal Justice Wyoming and the Equal Justice Wyoming Foundation jointly determined grant awards. This streamlined the grant process for our grantees, and it also allowed the boards from both organizations to consider gaps in services and funding to take a comprehensive view of where and how resources were being utilized. The joint grant making was successful, and we look forward to the continued partnership with the Equal Justice Wyoming Foundation.


Pro Bono Programs and Initiatives

Wyoming Free Legal Answers

The Wyoming Free Legal Answers (WFLA) online portal, wyoming.freelegalanswers.org, was launched in August 2016, in partnership with the American Bar Association, as a virtual legal clinic. The website screens applicants for eligibility and allows eligible individuals to submit civil legal questions and relevant documents via a secure portal. Attorneys licensed to practice law in Wyoming can register as volunteers to provide pro bono services through the site. Equal Justice provides the day-to-day administrative functions for the site. This includes ensuring that only Wyoming-licensed attorneys in good standing are permitted to respond to user submissions, and moderating questions, for example by removing questions about criminal issues. Equal Justice also sends updates to the volunteer lawyers and provides resources for both lawyers and clients.



The portal is a valuable resource that reaches Wyomingites in rural and underserved areas of the state, as well as those with limited access to transportation or childcare. The portal can be accessed from the user's home computer or cell phone, any time of day. In FY 2023, twenty volunteer attorneys provided legal advice and assistance through WFLA to address 376 questions submitted on the site, resulting in a 92% answer rate.



Volunteer Reference Attorney Program

The Volunteer Reference Attorney Program (VRA) places attorneys in courthouses and libraries across the state to provide legal information, explain court procedures, and assist litigants in completing pro se forms. It is often difficult for self-represented litigants to understand the complex civil justice system, and the VRA helps people navigate confusing court processes and procedures. Equal Justice recruits volunteer attorneys to hold “office hours” in the participating

courthouses and libraries on the first Thursday of each month. The consistently-high volume of court users attending the VRA in Casper over the past year necessitated increasing the frequency to two VRA sessions per month in that location, beginning in June 2023; and we are reviewing the need to add a second session each month in other locations as well. There are currently seven VRA locations across the state. The VRA sessions are held in the county courthouses in Cheyenne, Green River, Laramie, Rawlins, and Sheridan. Sessions are held in the county libraries in Casper and Gillette. In total, 488 individuals were assisted by 48 Volunteer Reference Attorneys in FY 2023.





Volunteer Lawyers Program

Equal Justice manages the statewide Volunteer Lawyers Program in partnership with the Wyoming State Bar. We provide resources and support to volunteer attorneys in order to encourage and facilitate the delivery of pro bono legal services to low-income clients. The type of assistance provided by the attorneys ranges from advice and brief services to full representation of clients. The pro bono program processed 119 cases in FY 2023.



Online Legal Information and Resources

Equal Justice launched our website, <https://equaljustice.wy.gov/>, in November 2012. Since then, we have continually expanded the site and updated the content to provide information, resources, videos, online classrooms, and pro se forms that address the most common civil legal issues faced by low-income individuals. The website is an important tool that allows the public to understand their legal rights and access legal information in plain language. In FY 2023, our website had 65,761 site visits by 45,091 unique users.

LiveChat

In order to assist website visitors and direct individuals to the information they need, Equal Justice's website has a LiveChat feature. This tool helps users navigate our expansive website to find appropriate resources to address their needs. The LiveChat is similar to a remote self-help center in that it does not provide legal advice but instead helps guide people to relevant information and trusted resources. In FY 2023, 218 visitors to our website received assistance from a trained LiveChat operator. The majority of the LiveChat volunteers are law students at the University of Wyoming College of Law. An Equal

Justice AmeriCorps VISTA (Volunteers In Service To America) member recruits law student volunteers, provides training on the LiveChat software, and helps manage the volunteer schedule. Over the next year we hope to increase the number of LiveChat volunteers.

AmeriCorps VISTA Program

The Equal Justice Wyoming AmeriCorps VISTA Program continues to attract inspiring individuals who want to serve Wyoming communities while learning about the importance of access to justice. Three VISTA Members committed to spending the 2022-2023 service year in our program. Mathias Lang served in the Equal Justice office. Miranda Host served with Cheyenne Regional Medical Center's Wyoming Institute for Population Health, and Frances Jacobson served with Habitat for Humanity of Laramie County. All three brought compassion and enthusiasm to their roles and had tremendous impacts.

Mathias carried on the essential work of community outreach. He visited libraries, state agencies, and social service providers around the state and on the Wind River Reservation to share information about free legal resources and events. As a result of Mathias's efforts, we saw increased attendance at events in Casper, Gillette, and Fort Washakie. Mathias also assisted the College of Law's Civil Legal Services Clinic and Estate Planning Practicum in organizing, advertising, and hosting several outreach events and a legal resource fair.

Frances's service with Habitat for Humanity of Laramie County focused primarily on in-depth research for and production of a Legal Barriers to Affordable Housing study. Frances brought patience, perseverance, and professionalism to this lengthy project. She produced a report that has already become a valuable tool for organizations and academics working in the field of affordable housing. Her report served as the basis for the senior capstone project in a University of Wyoming Construction Management course. Frances also translated Habitat documents into Spanish to ease housing processes for non-native English speakers.

During her year with Cheyenne Regional, Miranda was instrumental in establishing policies and protocols for the Overdose Fatality Review Panel. She worked cooperatively with stakeholders from very diverse disciplines. Miranda was able to establish common ground as the association of professionals focused on their objective of reducing overdose fatalities and the stigma associated with substance use. Miranda also worked on the wrap-up of the Emergency Rental Assistance Program, and she helped Cheyenne Regional prepare to do essential work in the arena of affordable housing.

Equal Justice Wyoming is grateful to Miranda, Frances, and Mathias for dedicating a year of their lives to serving the people of Wyoming.



Supporting Statewide Civil Legal Services through Grants

Equal Justice’s mission to provide a statewide delivery system for civil legal aid is largely carried out through our grants to nonprofit legal service organizations. In FY 2023, Equal Justice and the Equal Justice Wyoming Foundation provided a total of \$1,611,654, including \$651,321 in Equal Justice state funds, \$248,293 of Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) funds from the Division of Victim Services to increase civil legal services to victims of crime and \$448,497 in Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP) funds to provide legal services to support housing stability. This year the Equal Justice Wyoming Foundation, a separate nonprofit with an aligned mission, jointly made grant awards and contributed \$125,000 in funds to the amounts awarded. In addition, the Foundation helped fill gaps in services in Laramie County by providing \$138,543 in funds received from the Laramie County Commissioners from the American Rescue Plan Act (Laramie County ARPA). In total, 3,895 clients received legal services through the grant programs we fund and administer.



Legal Aid of Wyoming, Inc.

Statewide Legal Advice and Intake Hotline

Equal Justice has partnered with Legal Aid of Wyoming to ensure individuals across the state have access to legal advice through a telephone hotline. The hotline allows individuals to receive advice in real time and to apply for legal services over the phone. Legal Aid of Wyoming operates the hotline Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The hotline is vital for many people in rural areas with limited access to a physical legal aid office. The hotline number is widely distributed by court clerks and librarians to individuals who are looking for legal advice and assistance.

As people increasingly need to access legal help remotely, the hotline is an effective and efficient way to provide legal advice and to process applications for people across the entire state, including rural and underserved areas. Clients are screened for eligibility before any advice or services are provided, and an application may then be taken.




2,365 callers received legal help

Legal Aid of Wyoming Cases

Beginning in June 2013, Equal Justice partnered with Legal Aid of Wyoming by awarding grants to expand services throughout the state, which supported the addition of three new offices. Since that time, Equal Justice has continued to provide funds to operate the additional offices in Rock Springs, Gillette, and Cody. These communities previously had not had a legal aid office. Unfortunately, due to budget cuts, Legal Aid of Wyoming plans to close the Gillette office to reduce costs. Services to that area of the state will continue to be provided. Legal Aid of Wyoming staff attorneys handled 898 legal matters through Equal Justice and ERAP grants in FY 2023.




898 legal matters handled in 2023

In addition to the Equal Justice state funds, Legal Aid of Wyoming received a grant of Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP) funds through Equal Justice. These funds were used to provide civil legal services with the aim of helping ERAP-eligible clients obtain or maintain safe and stable housing. The ERAP funding has been instrumental in addressing the legal issues that many individuals who were affected by the COVID-19 pandemic continue to face. In June 2023, ERAP financial assistance for rent and utilities ended in the state of Wyoming after the state expended the available funds. The ERAP funds supporting ongoing civil legal services will end, as mandated by the State of Wyoming, on September 30, 2023. As individuals face skyrocketing housing costs and the loss of financial assistance, we anticipate an increase in evictions and housing matters.

Wyoming Coalition Against Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault

The Wyoming Coalition Against Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault (“the Coalition”) is a statewide legal aid provider serving victims of abuse and other crimes. The services the Coalition provides are vital to help protect victims from further harm. The Coalition’s services go beyond getting protective orders. Holistic services are employed to address many issues related to abuse. Many of the Coalition’s cases are complex and time-consuming; however, these services are vital to help stabilize families and individuals who have experienced domestic violence, sexual assault, or stalking.




232 cases handled in 2023

Equal Justice has provided substantial funding to support the work of the Coalition since 2012. The funds have expanded the availability of legal services and have allowed the Coalition to open satellite offices in Casper, Cody, Fort Washakie, and Gillette, in addition to maintaining their primary office in Laramie. In FY 2023, the Coalition determined that they needed to close the physical offices in Cody and Gillette in order to lower operating costs. The Coalition continues to serve clients in the Cody and Gillette regions by maintaining local staff attorneys who work without a traditional brick and mortar office

building. The organization is committed to providing statewide services to victims. The Coalition handled 232 cases in FY 2023 with the Equal Justice, VOCA, ERAP, and Laramie County ARPA funds that they received.

Wyoming Children's Law Center

The Wyoming Children's Law Center (WCLC) provides legal services in cases involving children and families. The WCLC's services include traditional family law cases as well as other matters that are vitally important to children's well-being. For example, the WCLC provides advocacy to ensure children receive special education services to which they are entitled. The WCLC fills a great unmet need. The grants from Equal Justice and Laramie County ARPA funds support a wide variety of civil legal services, which allowed the WCLC to handle 121 cases in FY 2023.



Medical-Legal Partnership at Cheyenne Regional Medical Center

Cheyenne Regional Medical Center received a grant from Equal Justice to operate a Medical-Legal Partnership (MLP). MLPs are being developed across the country to address health-harming legal issues. Cheyenne Regional's MLP handles various legal matters ranging from landlord-tenant cases where safe housing is at issue to denials of public benefits that leave individuals unable to afford healthcare. The MLP incorporates a lawyer into a medical team to identify and address patients' legal needs in order to improve their health. The MLP partners with HealthWorks medical clinic


in Cheyenne, and also receives referrals from other health care providers. With funding from ERAP and Laramie County ARPA funds, in total, the two MLP attorneys handled 140 legal matters in FY 2023.



Thanks to a grant from the Hughes Charitable Foundation to the Equal Justice Wyoming Foundation, the EJW Foundation has taken exciting steps to expand MLP services to additional areas of the state, with the hopes of eventually having a statewide network of MLP services. We look forward to reporting on these additional developments over the next year.

Teton County Access to Justice Center

The Teton County Access to Justice Center (TCATJC) was launched in 2012 with funding from Equal Justice. The TCATJC is housed in space donated by Teton County and shares the space with the county law library. The TCATJC provides legal information and self-help services to individuals in Teton, Sublette, and Lincoln Counties. Eligible applicants may also apply for legal representation through a panel of private contract attorneys who provide legal services at no cost to the client. Those services are paid by TCATJC at a reduced rate using the Equal Justice grant funds. In FY 2023, the TCATJC handled 65 cases.




University of Wyoming College of Law

The University of Wyoming College of Law operates several legal clinics that provide experiential learning for law students. Law students assist low-income individuals under the supervision of a law school professor. Equal Justice provides financial support for the Family and Child Legal Advocacy Clinic and the Civil Legal Services Clinic.


Family and Child Legal Advocacy Clinic

The Family and Child Legal Advocacy Clinic handles a wide variety of cases, including divorce, child support, adoption, paternity, child custody, modifications, domestic violence, stalking and sexual assault protection orders, guardian ad litem appointments in juvenile and child custody cases, representation of parents in juvenile court, termination of parental rights, and other civil actions involving children. In FY 2023, the clinic handled 41 cases.

Civil Legal Services Clinic



The Civil Legal Services Clinic assists clients with a wide range of civil legal needs. This includes housing, expungements, consumer rights, education, veterans' service-connected disability benefits, and other public benefits. The clinic handled 33 cases in FY 2023.

Supporting Access to Justice

In addition to Equal Justice's work supporting legal and self-help services, our staff also contribute to projects that advance other access to justice initiatives. Over the past year, our staff members served on several committees and working groups, including Access to Justice 2.0 (ATJ 2.0) committees.

The Wyoming Access to Justice Commission's ATJ 2.0 Pro Se Forms Committee is a small group consisting of court clerks, judicial staff, practicing lawyers, and other interested stakeholders and experts. Over the past year the Committee made necessary updates and revisions to six of the family law pro se packets. The Committee also researched the processes that other states utilize to create and maintain pro se forms. The Committee ultimately compiled the information gathered from this research and submitted a proposal and recommendation to the Wyoming Judicial Council (WJC) to create a Permanent Standing Committee for Pro Se Forms, which has now been formed. Equal Justice staff will provide support to the WJC's Pro Se Forms Committee.

The ATJ 2.0 Multistakeholder Court Navigator Committee spent the past year researching navigator programs in other states and the use of non-lawyers to assist self-represented litigants. In its 2023-2024 Strategic Plan, the Wyoming Judicial Branch prioritized creating a court navigator program. The Committee compiled research and submitted a proposal in support of the plan to establish a court navigator program. The WJC is now in the process of developing a pilot program.


The ATJ 2.0 Pro Bono Committee was formed to identify and examine obstacles that prevent attorneys from providing pro bono legal services. The Committee consists of Equal Justice and Wyoming State Bar staff, private attorneys in larger firms and solo practice, judicial staff, and other stakeholders. The Committee is exploring ways to encourage and expand pro bono services in Wyoming.

Ongoing Projects

Equal Justice continues to work on projects aimed at improving the effectiveness of our program operations, our services, and our grantees. In FY 2023, work was undertaken to develop uniform outcome measures for civil legal services to help improve data collection and analysis across grantees and programs. That work is nearly complete, and the uniform outcomes will be implemented in FY 2024. American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds received by Equal Justice are also being used to move our grantees onto a common case management system to increase efficiency and the quality of data reporting. We now have five programs, including Equal Justice, on the common case management system with a sixth program in the process of getting set up. Also using ARPA funds, a redesign is planned for our website to improve its usability. Additionally, we are working to automate the pro se packets in order to simplify the use of the court forms by self-represented litigants. We look forward to reporting on the progress of these projects in the coming year.

Message from Chief Justice Kate Fox –Judicial Council Chairwoman

The Board of Judicial Policy and Administration has been the governing body of the Wyoming Judicial Branch for more than 20 years. The BJPA successfully guided the Judicial Branch through Covid19 emerging stronger than ever. The Branch demonstrated its resiliency by using technology and ingenuity to adapt its processes and procedures to comply with recommended health precautions, and it experienced the benefits of working together as a Branch. At its September meetings, the BJPA members voted to change the name of the BJPA to the Wyoming Judicial Council. The new name more clearly expresses the entity's role, and the change represents a shift in the Judicial Branch's approach to its governance, as expressed in its vision statement:

The Wyoming Judiciary is a cohesive and collaborative court system, characterized by excellence, that provides justice for the individual and society through the rule of law. The Wyoming Judicial Branch is committed to excellence in:

- Delivering just and efficient resolution of people's disputes;
- Promoting public confidence in the law and providing access to justice;
- Faithfully discharging our duties through adherence to the law;
- Ensuring fairness and impartiality by providing quality service that continuously improves, that meets or exceeds the public expectations, and that ensures all are treated with courtesy, dignity and respect;

- Fostering an expectation of excellence in the work of the Judiciary through recruitment, training and retention of all judicial officers and employees;
- Acting as a cooperative and collaborative system that speaks with a single voice and shares a common purpose; and
- Ensuring the highest professional conduct, integrity and competence of the bench and bar.

With renewed confidence and an infusion of new judges, the Wyoming Judicial Council now looks forward to bigger steps to adapt the constantly changing demands upon courts and court staff.

Innovation

The Judicial Branch Innovation (JBI) taskforce is leading a branch-wide, post-pandemic examination on how to improve Wyoming's court system. Under the leadership of Retired District Court Judge John Perry, and with the assistance of the National Center for State Courts, JBI members Chief Justice Kate Fox and Justice Lynne Boomgaarden, District Court Judges Catherine Wilking and Jason Conder, and Circuit Court Judges Wendy Bartlett and Nate Hibben, are meeting monthly to identify and prioritize challenges facing the delivery of justice in Wyoming.

JBI's ultimate charge is to recommend short- and long-term solutions to the demands of a changing post-pandemic world for the Judicial Council's consideration. Challenges the JBI task force has identified to date involve staff and training; the mental well-being of litigants, judges and judicial personnel; technology use; docket management; timely decision-making; and sufficient resources for self-represented litigants. It is also no secret that the Judicial Branch – Wyoming's third, co-equal branch of government – is underfunded. The courts need sufficient resources to efficiently and effectively fulfill their constitutional duty to deliver equal justice to all.

Though nearly all Wyoming judges report that they like their jobs, we know we can do better – better for judges, judicial staff, lawyers, and the litigants we collectively serve.

New Judges

Over the past year and a half, the Wyoming Judicial Branch has welcomed fourteen new judges, with more on the way. These vacancies were created for a number of reasons: several judges retired, some transitioned from one jurisdiction to another, two were the result of new district judge positions created by the Legislature (and a third one next year), and several resulted from judges choosing different career paths.

Wyoming uses a Merit Selection System for seating a new judge, which is governed by Article 5, section 4 of the Wyoming Constitution. Applicants provide a thorough expression of interest to the Judicial Nominating Commission, which then reviews the submissions and select applicants to interview. The Judicial Nominating Commission then interviews the selected applicants within the district where the vacancy has occurred and sends the three most qualified names to the Governor. The Governor then has thirty days to hold separate interviews with the three candidates and announce the appointment. Typically, the Governor waits close to the thirty days to announce the decision to allow citizens to provide comment on the candidates.

Once appointed, each judge or justice must stand for retention throughout their judgeship. All members of the Judiciary must initially stand for retention at the next general election after serving for one full year. Thereafter, Supreme Court justices stand for retention every eight years, District Court judges stand for retention every six years, and Circuit Court judges stand for retention every four years.

Finally, Wyoming Supreme Court justices and District Court judges are required to retire at age 70. (Circuit Courts were created by statute and do not have a mandatory retirement age.) HJ001, passed by the legislature in 2022, will raise the mandatory

retirement age to 75, if the voters agree to the constitutional amendment in the November election. Although some judges may not stay past the age of 70, others may continue to meaningfully contribute to the law in our State for several additional years before retiring, saving the state money in the process.

System Modernization

Case Management System

The Supreme Court began the process of updating the trial court's case management system in 2016. The long and tedious process of tailoring and implementing the off-the-shelf product is getting close to being complete. The circuit courts have been fully rolled out on the new system since 2020 and district courts are expected be complete by late 2023 or early 2024. The newly formed Chancery Court was created using this new case management system as well.

EFiled

EFiled has been available in chancery court since its opening in December 2021. The first district court went live on the system in late August. Albany County District Court is the pilot court for eFiled, meaning that attorneys practicing in that court have the opportunity to eFile.

The implementation of eFiled in the district courts will be staggered, which means that not all courts will have eFiled available at the same time. If all goes according to plan, attorneys will be able to eFile in four district courts by the end of 2022 with all courts live on the system by the end of 2024.

KUDO

KUDO is a multilingual collaboration platform that allows court interpreters to provide remote court interpretation in both the simultaneous and consecutive modes of interpretation on Microsoft Teams. Put another way, KUDO enables court interpreters

located anywhere to interpret into another language in real-time on Microsoft Teams as if they were present in the courtroom. This product was purchased with American Recovery Plan funds appropriated by the Legislature.

Access to Justice

The Access to Justice Commission is an advisory body to the Supreme Court to address statutory obligations under the 2010 Wyoming Civil Legal Services Act (Wyo. Stat. Ann. § 5-2-121, et. seq.) The Commission also provides oversight and support to Equal Justice Wyoming – the state funded civil legal services program. Through its new initiative, Access to Justice 2.0, the Commission is working with multiple stakeholders to identify and implement alternative and creative ways to help the increasing number of Wyoming citizens and small businesses who appear in civil court proceedings without an attorney.

Equal Justice Wyoming works with Wyoming legal aid providers and community organizations specifically to help people with limited income find help with legal issues. Equal Justice Wyoming programs include:

Pro Bono Programs and Initiatives

The Wyoming Free Legal Answers, in partnership with the American Bar Association, offers free legal advice. The website screens applicants for eligibility and allows eligible individuals to submit civil legal questions via a secure portal. Attorneys licensed to practice law in Wyoming can register as volunteers to answer questions. In fiscal year 2022, this program addressed 326 legal questions.

The Volunteer Reference Attorney Program places attorneys in courthouses and libraries to provide legal information, explain court procedures, and assist litigants in completing pro se forms. During fiscal year 2022, volunteer attorneys assisted 295 individuals.

In partnership with the Wyoming State Bar, Equal Justice Wyoming manages the statewide Volunteer Lawyers Program. Assistance provided by attorneys range from advice to full representation of clients. The pro bono program processed 102 cases in fiscal year 2022.

Online Legal Information and Resources

Equal Justice Wyoming continually updates website content to provide information, resources, videos, online classrooms, and pro se forms that address the most common civil legal issues faced by low-income individuals. In fiscal year 2022, the website saw 62,209 site visits by 40,603 unique users.

LiveChat is like a remote self-help center that guides individuals to appropriate information and trusted resources. The majority of LiveChat volunteers are law students. Those volunteers assisted 405 visitors in fiscal year 2022.

Statewide Civil Legal Services Support through Grants

Equal Justice Wyoming's mission to provide a statewide delivery system for civil legal aid is largely carried out through grants to nonprofit legal service organizations. In fiscal year 2022, grants in the amount of \$1,536,738 were provided. Of note, \$407,202 of Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) funds increased civil legal services to victims of crime, and \$278,521 in Emergency Rental Assistance (ERAP) funds provided legal services to support housing stability.

Employee Compensation

Through a grant from the State Justice Institute, the Board is working with the National Center for State Courts to analyze employee compensation and compare rates of equivalent positions throughout the State, and sister states. The results of this study will allow the Board to create a compensation plan for the Judicial Branch, similar to that currently used by the Executive Branch.

Message from Chief Justice Kate Fox – Wyoming Judicial Council Chairwoman

The Wyoming Judicial Council has exercised strong leadership in the past year to move the Judicial Branch forward and adapt to better serve the people of Wyoming. Covid taught us that we can be agile, and we will continue to apply some of the lessons learned in that crisis. We know that courts are not just a location, they are a service, and that service can be provided in different forms by using technology. Although making that technology available to the public can add to court staff tasks – for example, scheduling and training for remote hearings, scanning paper documents – our goal is to make courts accessible to the people of Wyoming. We continue to exercise the agile mindset to address other challenges facing the Judicial Branch.

Court Navigator Pilot

The Court Navigator pilot is designed to assist individuals in navigating the complex legal system, and to provide mechanism to connect individuals to legal referral programs when necessary. Courts are seeing increasing numbers of self-represented litigants (SRLs) each year. Understandably, most SRLs do not grasp basic court processes, and assessments indicate that the leading barrier facing SRLs in court is difficulty understanding court rules and procedures. The Wyoming Judicial Branch will launch a court navigation program to provide guidance and information related to court processes and procedures and help people involved in these cases connect to available resources. Such a program will assist individuals with participating in their legal matters and will increase the likelihood that SRLs submit timely and complete filings, which can improve the overall efficiency of courts.

To ensure the efficacy of a court navigator program, the Judicial Branch will pilot the project in Natrona County. The planning stage is underway, and the pilot launch is slated for first quarter 2024.

Diversion Pilot

Nearly 1 in 5 Americans live with mental illness, and those suffering are 10 times more likely to be incarcerated than they are to be hospitalized. Nationwide, 70% of incarcerated individuals suffer from serious mental illness, substance abuse, or both. At the end of 2017, 90% of Wyoming's 2,500 inmates in the Department of Corrections System required some form of substance abuse treatment. In 2020, 86% of Wyoming's inmate population had a behavioral health need. These statistics are staggering, but jails are not treatment centers, and they were never intended to be. The unfortunate reality is that the criminal justice system has become a primary referral source, the entry point, to obtain treatment and services.

Recognizing the need to avoid the constant recycling of individuals with mental illness through the criminal justice system, the Judicial Branch is part of a three-branch project which will pilot a diversion program in Campbell County. The goal is to divert low-level, non-violent offenders away from the system and into treatment to address the underlying and unmet mental health needs that lead to criminal behavior. Diverting and providing treatment will save money and put those saved resources to work improving the lives of individuals with mental illness and assisting them in becoming contributing members of society. The pilot is scheduled to launch in early 2024.

When the court system consists of a robust and strong workforce, creative programs and initiatives can grow. These programs and initiatives provide better court services to all Wyoming citizens, and we will continue to strive to improve the judicial system for all.

Electronic Filing and Access

The Wyoming Judicial Branch continues its efforts to increase accessibility to courts statewide. Wyoming is a large and rural state, which often creates obstacles for people attempting to access the courts. The Branch provides remote methods to attend court hearings, when possible as it has for years, and the implementation of eFiling presents another exciting opportunity to increase access to Wyoming's courts. Details of the work the Judiciary has accomplished over the last year in its mission to provide eFiling to courts statewide can be found in the Wyoming Judicial Branch's 2023 eFiling Report.

Recent advances/legislative support

The Wyoming Judicial Council is grateful for the legislative support for the Judiciary during the 2022 and 2023 sessions and looks forward to continued support during the upcoming 2024 budget session. That support helps to secure the continued excellence of the Wyoming Judicial Branch into the future.

New district court judges

The 2022 Legislative session saw the creation of three new district court judge positions. Those positions have provided relief to the Third Judicial District (Sweetwater, Uinta, and Lincoln Counties) and the Seventh Judicial District (Natrona County). We anticipate the construction of the fourth district court courtroom in Campbell County will be completed at the end of 2023, so we expect to request funding for the district judge position in the Sixth Judicial District (Campbell, Weston, and Crook Counties). These new positions have gone a long way toward decreasing the pressure on court staff and judges and speeding up resolution of legal matters in those courts.

Judicial pay raises

In addition to the relief provided through new Judgeships, the Legislature also recognized the need to ensure qualified applicants for vacant judicial seats, and provided a pay raise for all Wyoming judges. The Judiciary appreciates the action taken by the Legislature, and will keep working to maintain a well-qualified and skillful Judiciary.

Employee pay raises

Pay raises in 2023 for Judicial Branch employees, along with State employees in the Legislative and Executive branches, provided a much-needed boost for the courts in their efforts to attract and retain qualified employees.

Treatment courts

The 2023 Legislature passed a bill that transitions the administration of the court-supervised treatment program from the Wyoming Department of Health to the Judiciary. This is a welcome change, and the Judicial Branch looks forward to supporting the treatment courts throughout the state. The Branch is working diligently with the Department of Health to ensure a smooth transition. It has also created a committee of stakeholders to review the current structure of treatment courts and explore avenues to enhance the use of those courts statewide. A comprehensive plan detailing the transition was submitted August 1, 2023 to the Joint Judiciary Committee as required by the

legislation.

Legislative Initiatives

Employee pay – seeking parity with other State of Wyoming employees

At this time the Wyoming Judicial Council believes our employee pay is a higher priority than judicial salaries; that is why we will not seek judicial pay raises this coming year. Instead, we will request a pay increase for Judicial Branch employees that will put them on equal footing with other State workers. Over the last year the Wyoming Judicial Branch has created reliable pay tables for the Branch using the Hay Methodology employed by the Executive Branch. This classification and compensation structure was used by the Judicial Council to allocate the increase in funding for employee pay approved by the Legislature during the 2023 Legislative Session. For the first time in its history, the Judicial Branch can accurately measure the compensation of its employees in comparison to the market value of Judicial Branch positions. That analysis indicates that, on average, Judicial Branch employees are compensated at 83% of market. In comparison, the Executive Branch currently sits at an average of 94% of market. While the increase in employee compensation during the 2023 session was appreciated, Judicial Branch employees must be compensated proportionate to the other branches of government.

Circuit Court clerks – a shortage affects service to litigants

Recently, the Judicial Branch worked with the National Center for State Courts (NCSC) to create a new workload study for the circuit courts in Wyoming. The workload study provides an objective measure of the time it takes to perform the day-to-day tasks required of a circuit court judge and a circuit court clerk. The study revealed a substantial need for circuit court clerk positions statewide. As a result, the Judiciary will be requesting nine new circuit court clerk positions during the upcoming legislative session.

The circuit courts in Wyoming are the people's court. Most citizens who come into contact with the judicial system in Wyoming will do so in the circuit court. Circuit courts are responsible for deciding cases involving traffic tickets, protection orders, low-level crimes (misdemeanors), eviction actions, small claims complaints, and civil actions resulting in damages less than \$50,000. The clerks serve as a primary contact point for citizens when

they come into the judicial system, which underlies the importance of ensuring that the clerks' offices are adequately staffed to provide excellent service to those citizens.

Administrative Office of the Courts – Staffing to better support courts and litigant services

In 2022, the Wyoming Judicial Branch engaged the NCSC to facilitate discussions surrounding the redesign of the Judiciary. At the conclusion of those discussions, the NCSC submitted a report to the Wyoming Judicial Branch detailing five recommendations. Two recommendations are focused on the need to provide staffing for the AOC to adequately support the Branch. Comparing to the AOCs in other states, the NCSC stated:

Based on comparative analysis, the Wyoming AOC is extremely understaffed to address the needs of the branch. The Wyoming AOC employs approximately 35 people in 5 divisions. In contrast is the Minnesota AOC which employs 330 people in 6 divisions and Washington AOC which employs 240 people over 4 divisions. The population of the state of Wyoming is approximately 579,495 according to Wyoming Population 2022. The state of New Hampshire has a population of 1,389,741, New Hampshire Population 2022, but their caseload is smaller than that of Wyoming. The AOC of New Hampshire employs 50 people in 9 divisions. The state of Vermont has similar population, and similar caseloads. However, the 2020 data indicates that the number of cases per 100K for Vermont is 15,192, while the number for Wyoming is 25,168. The AOC of Vermont employs approximately 64 people for trial courts.¹

Lack of staffing in the AOC has stymied its ability to adapt and respond to the myriad of pressures facing the courts. Increased staffing in the AOC will lead to increased support not only for the Judges and court staff, but also for litigants and the public who encounter the justice system.

The continued success and ingenuity of the Wyoming Judicial Branch depends on adequate resources. The Branch has historically prided itself on its austerity budget, and when courts were places where parties appeared with lawyers and judges called balls

and strikes, that may have worked. Courts today are much more than that. They provide a variety of services to Wyoming citizens far beyond the traditional court model. Many parties are self-represented, thus requiring more court services and more judge time. There are more domestic cases, which tend to continue for longer periods of time. There are many more people with mental illness, more commitment proceedings, and greater delays in criminal proceedings involving mentally ill defendants. Our 55 judges must be provided with meaningful and useful judicial education. As with any organization, complying with federal and state laws governing employment takes more time. Today's Judicial Branch must provide far more complex services, and that takes staff. Those complex services are often borne by the Judges, or not adequately provided at all, because the Judiciary has not adapted to the new normal. A healthy Judiciary requires resources to adapt to a changing society so Judges can be primarily Judges, and the complexity of providing excellent service to the people of Wyoming can be borne by court administration staff, clerks, and chambers staff.

Court security

The security of judges, court staff, and citizens in courthouses has garnered increasing attention in recent years, for good reason. Nationwide, threats on judicial officers have increased exponentially. The U.S. Marshals Service reported that threats and other inappropriate communications targeting judges and other court personnel rose from 926 in 2015 to 3,706 in 2022 – a 300% increase.² Between 2015 and 2023, Wyoming saw a 166% increase in reported security incidents in courthouses across the state – from 41 in 2015 to 109 in 2023.³ During the 2023 interim, the Joint Judiciary Committee introduced several bills addressing court security. These bills are imperative to health and well-being of the Judicial Branch and to the rule of law.

Threats to physical safety are extremely troubling when directed at any individual engaged in public service. And, when it pertains to judges, this

culture of intolerance is particularly problematic. The judiciary is the branch of government specifically designed to be insulated from intimidation, harassment, political pressures, and fear of retribution so that judges can render decisions that are fair, impartial and independent. The justice system depends on adherence to this principle.⁴

Efiling Report

A priority and major focus of the Judicial Branch has been to implement eFiling initially in the district courts, with an eye toward deploying eFiling in all trial courts over the coming years. The Judiciary is pleased to report eFiling has been implemented in the first district court.

District Court eFiling Rollout

eFiling has been available in chancery court since its opening in December 2021. The first district court went live on the system in late August. Albany County District Court is the pilot court for eFiling, and attorneys practicing in that court now have the opportunity to eFile documents.

The implementation of eFiling in the district courts will be staggered, meaning that not all courts will have eFiling available at the same time. This approach is necessary for a few reasons. First, there must be a reliable case management system in place to ensure the success of eFiling. The Judiciary is in the process of implementing that system. Second, Court Administration provides the training and support for some pieces of eFiling. With the limited staff available, a statewide rollout would be unwise and untenable. Third, as it has been found with other court automation systems, it is imperative that eFiling be piloted to ensure its integrity before it is fully rolled out to the rest of the state. If all goes according to plan, attorneys will be able to eFile in four district courts by the end of 2022 with all courts live on the system by the end of 2024.

System Overview

To work in the manner attorneys expect, eFiling is not a stand-alone system. Its functionality is highly dependent on a reliable case management system to provide the foundation and information needed to operate.

The Judicial Branch began the implementation of a uniform case management system in the district courts in 2009. At that time, the individual clerks of district court utilized four different electronic case

management systems. The uniform case management system, WyUser, was piloted in three courts in 2012, and was fully rolled out by 2014. The shift to WyUser was critical to accomplish the goal of getting all district courts on the same system. However, WyUser could not adequately support eFiling.

In 2016, the Supreme Court entered into contracts to provide an updated case management system to the district courts, Full Court Enterprise. Court Administration has worked through an intensive process with various committees since January 2017 to tailor this off-the-shelf system for the needs of Wyoming. Rollout of that system began in July 2021. Twelve courts will be live on the new system by the end of the year.

In June of 2019, the eFiling project was put out for a request for quotation. Four vendors responded, and three were selected to provide demonstrations of their systems. Chief Justice Michael K. Davis created an ad hoc eFiling Committee to help with vendor selection. The eFiling Committee consists of a cross-section of users of the eFiling system, including the Chief Justice, a district court judge, attorneys from a broad array of practices, clerks of district court, a district court judicial assistant, and a court reporter.

The Committee spent days sifting through vendor demonstrations, testing the various systems, and having frank discussions regarding the selection. The Committee recommended File & ServeXpress as the eFiling vendor in Wyoming. That decision was ultimately approved by the Wyoming Supreme Court. Contract negotiations with the vendor began in the summer of 2020, and contracts were executed by the end of that year.

The eFiling Committee has also devoted many hours over the last year creating Rules for Electronic Filing and Service in District Courts (eFiling Rules), which can be accessed here:

refine the rules that will govern eFiling in the Wyoming district courts. The rules were distributed to the Bar for comment in early February. After reviewing those comments and making tweaks to the Rules, the Committee recommended adoption by the Supreme Court. The rules were adopted by the Court on June 28, 2022 and became effective on August 29, 2022.

The process has been challenging at times, but Wyoming district courts will all have the same updated case management system, and offer eFiling to the citizens of Wyoming in all district courts, by 2025. The systems will provide increased convenience for users, and greater efficiency for the courts.

Circuit Courts

During the 2022 legislative session, funding was appropriated for eFiling in the circuit courts. Court Administration is currently working on contracts to implement the eFiling system selected by the eFiling Committee in the circuit courts. When that is complete, work will begin to configure the system for circuit courts and eventually begin the process of implementing eFiling in the circuit courts of Wyoming increasing access to all jurisdictional levels of the courts.

EFiling Report

The Wyoming Judicial Branch continues its efforts to increase accessibility to courts statewide. Wyoming is a large and rural state, which often creates obstacles for people attempting to access the courts. The Branch provides remote methods to attend court hearings, when possible as it has for years, and the implementation of eFiling presents another exciting opportunity to increase access to Wyoming's courts.

System Overview

Electronic Filing is not a stand-alone system. Its functionality is highly dependent on a reliable case management system to provide the foundation and information needed to operate. A case management system houses the record of the court and provides a method for clerks to keep that record accurately while accounting for money flowing in and out of the clerk's office. In Wyoming, the eFiling system is designed and intended to integrate with the case management system to push and pull documents and data into both systems to allow for a complete electronic record.

Historically, Wyoming courts have worked in a paper-based system. While the courts used a case management system to organize the record and account for money, the official record of the court was the paper record kept in file folders in the clerks' offices statewide. The rules governing electronic filing in the courts has shifted that historic approach, making the official record of the court the electronic record housed in the case management system.

Chancery Court eFiling

Chancery Court opened its doors in December 2021 as an electronic court. Electronic filing in the Chancery Court is mandatory, and paper filings are permitted only upon permission of the court, and with exceptional cause shown. An electronic court allows:

- the flexibility to file and serve documents instantaneously without the delay of mail;
- the ability for two district court judges (Judge Steve Sharpe, Laramie County District Court, and Judge Rick Lavery, Sweetwater County District Court) to preside over the Chancery Court from their home locations; and

- the consistency and ease for the clerks and staff of the court to work in one, electronic system rather than processing cases both electronically and in paper.

While an electronic court is not without disadvantages the flexibility and uniformity of process it provides to attorneys, litigants, judges, and court staff illustrates the improvements and convenience that could be recognized in trial courts statewide.

District Court eFiling Rollout

The first district court eFiling implementation took place in Albany County District Court in August 2022. As of August 2023, there are six courts live on the eFiling system – Albany County, Laramie County, Fremont County, Natrona County, Teton County, and Sublette County. Three more courts are scheduled to go live in 2023, including Sweetwater County, Lincoln County, and Uinta County. Electronic filing is slated to be available statewide in the district courts by the end of 2024.

Unlike Chancery Court, the district courts are using a hybrid approach to filing. Electronic Filing is permissible, but not mandatory. Attorneys can choose to either file electronically or in paper form (self-represented litigants are not currently permitted to eFile). This approach has created a few struggles that the courts, the clerks, and the Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) are working to overcome.

The rules governing electronic filing in the district courts provide that when a court goes live with eFiling, the official record of that court becomes the record housed in the case management system. The rule was intended to alleviate pressure on clerks' offices to maintain dual records – both paper and electronic. Many courts have fully implemented an electronic record, no longer keeping paper copies of filings.

The lack of a paper record has required the clerks' offices and the judges' chambers to work collaboratively to ensure Judges have the filings they need to make decisions. It has also required judges' chambers to adapt their processes to the electronic system, which because of some limitations, can be cumbersome. However, judges, clerks, and chambers' staff have found creative ways to adjust their practices to ensure that, despite these challenges, the work of the courts gets done timely and efficiently. The AOC also

continues to work with the vendors of the eFiling and case management systems, as well as the courts to identify and provide process improvements for courts and attorneys alike.

Circuit Courts

During the 2022 legislative session, funding was appropriated for eFiling in the circuit courts. The AOC is currently working on contracts to implement the eFiling system selected by the eFiling Committee in the circuit courts. When that is complete, work will begin to configure the system for circuit courts and eventually to implementing eFiling in the circuit courts of Wyoming increasing access to all jurisdictional levels of the courts.

Board of Judicial Policy and Administration Policy Statement for Supervision of Circuit Court Clerical Staff in Counties Without a Resident Judge and Circuit Courts With Multiple Judges In A Single Location

A. GENERAL POLICY STATEMENT FOR SUPERVISION OF CIRCUIT COURT CLERICAL STAFF IN COUNTIES WITHOUT A RESIDENT CIRCUIT COURT JUDGE

One of the circuit court judges within the judicial district shall have ultimate responsibility for supervising the court staff in the counties without a resident circuit court judge. The circuit court judges within the district shall submit their recommendation to the Board for the position of supervising judge. The Board shall have the final authority to appoint the supervising judge. In the event the circuit judges within the district do not make a recommendation, the Board shall appoint a supervising judge.

B. GENERAL POLICY STATEMENT FOR SUPERVISION OF CIRCUIT COURT CLERICAL STAFF IN COURTS WITH MULTIPLE JUDGES IN A SINGLE COURT LOCATION

When more than one judge presides in a single court location, one of the circuit court judges shall have ultimate responsibility for supervising the staff. The circuit court judges within the single court location shall submit their recommendation to the Board for the position of supervising judge. The Board shall have the final authority to appoint the supervising judge. In the event the circuit court judges do not make a recommendation, the Board shall appoint a supervising judge.

C. SPECIFIC ACTIONS:

1. On or before November 30th of each year, the circuit court judges within the affected courts and judicial districts shall submit their written recommendation to the Board of Judicial Policy and Administration. Recommendations need not be submitted if the recommended supervising judge remains the same.
2. The Board shall consider any changes or new recommendations at its December Board meeting of each year and make the appointments by December 31st of each year.

Wyoming Rules Governing Access to Case Records

Rule 1. Purposes and Scope.

- (a) *Purposes.* – These rules govern access to, and confidentiality of, Case Records.
- (b) *Scope.* – These rules apply to all Case Records, regardless of the physical form of the Case Record, the method of recording the information in the Case Record, or the method of storing the information in the Case Record. These rules do not authorize or permit access to Administrative Records or judicial work product.

Rule 2. Definitions.

- (a) The following definitions shall apply:
 - (1) “Access Level” means the level of access an Access User Group is afforded to a Case Record. The available Access Levels are:
 - (A) “Full Access” or “Fully Accessible” means that the designated Access User Group has complete access to the designated Case Records.
 - (B) “Limited Access” means that the designated Access User Group has access to the designated Case Records, but that access is limited in some way.
 - (C) “No Access” means that the designated Access User Group has no access to the designated Case Records, except by court order.
 - (D) “No Access if Requested” means that the designated Access User Group has no access to the designated Case Record if denial of access is requested by a party to the case as set forth in state statute or court rule.
 - (E) “Expunged by Operation of Law” means that the designated Access User Group has no access to the designated Case Record because the designated Case Record has been expunged by operation of law.
 - (2) “Access Security Matrix” means the most current matrix adopted and published by the Wyoming Supreme Court assigning Access Levels to Access User Groups to the Case Record.
 - (3) “Access User Group” means the group of persons sharing an Access Level. The available Access User Groups are:
 - (A) “Judge” which includes justices, judges, commissioners, and magistrates of the supreme, district, chancery, and circuit courts, including designated chambers’ staff.
 - (B) “Custodian” which includes the administrative authority responsible for the control, management, and release of the official record of the court and includes:
 - (i) The State Court Administrator and its designated staff;
 - (ii) The Supreme Court Clerk and its designated staff;
 - (iii) The Clerks of District Court and its designated staff;
 - (iv) The Chancery Court Clerk and its designated staff; and

- (v) The Chief Circuit Court Clerks and its designated staff.
- (C) “Filing Party” means the party or parties responsible for, and who physically filed a Case Record.
- (D) “Non-Filing Party” means a party or parties to a case who did not file the Case Record.
- (E) “Agency” means any governmental agency provided access to Case Records by state statute, court rule, or court order.
- (F) “Authorized Interested Person” means persons who are not a party to a case but who have an interest in the case, and who are given access to Case Records by state statute, court rule, or court order.
- (G) “Public” means any person, business, non-profit entity, organization, association, government agency (except as Agency is defined above), media organization, or other entities that access Case Records.
- (4) “Administrative Record” means any document or information that pertains to the management, supervision, or administration of the court which does not become part of the Case Record.
- (5) “Bulk Distribution” means the distribution of all, or a significant subset, of the information in Case Records, as is and without modification or compilation.
- (6) “Business Day” means Monday through Friday 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Mountain Time, excluding official state holiday closures or other court closures.
- (7) “Case Record” means any document, action, or information that is collected, received, or maintained by a court or clerk of court connected to a judicial proceeding. It shall include the index, calendar, docket, register of actions, record of proceedings, orders, decrees, judgments, and minute orders. Case Records shall be entered into and collected in the case management system. Case Record does not include Administrative Records, documents that have been disposed of under retention schedules, or any judicial or judicial staff work product, notes, and drafts.
- (8) “Case Record” includes the following records:
 - (A) “Archived Case Record” which include any Case Record stored at the Wyoming State Archives in paper, electronic, microfiche, or other form and that is not otherwise available to the Custodian.
 - (B) “Electronic Case Record” which includes any Case Record recorded in a form that only a computer or other technological device can process, irrespective of whether it also exists in physical form.
 - (C) “Paper Case Record” which includes any Case Record recorded in paper form or other tangible form, regardless of whether it also exists in electronic form.
- (9) “Compiled Information” means all information derived from the selection, aggregation, or reformulation by the court of some of the information from more than one individual Case Record.
- (10) “Electronic Filing” or “eFiling” means the process and task of filing with the clerk’s office using the official electronic filing system.
- (11) “Means of Access” means the method by which the Public obtains information in a Case Record. The available Means of Access are:

- (A) “Archive Access” which includes obtaining or inspecting Archived Case Records retrieved from the Wyoming State Archives by the Custodian in the court where the Case Records were located before archiving.
 - (B) “Physical Access” means obtaining or inspecting copies of existing Paper Case Records from the Custodian in the court where the current Case Records are located.
 - (C) “Terminal Access” means obtaining or inspecting Case Records from a display terminal located at a courthouse.
 - (D) “Remote Access” means obtaining or inspecting Electronic Case Records without the need to physically visit a court facility.
- (12) “Physical Exhibit” means non-documentary but non-sensitive exhibits such as clothing, samples of merchandise, and other tangible objects.
 - (13) “Sensitive and Bulky Exhibits” means sensitive exhibits such as money, drugs, child pornography, and firearms and bulky exhibits such as oversized charts and enlarged pictures.
 - (14) “Standard Exhibit” means documents, photographs, and video or other electronically stored data on a disk or storage device and does not include Sensitive and Bulky Exhibits.
 - (15) “Traditional Filing” means filing with the clerk’s office in paper or other tangible form.
 - (16) “Vendor” means any non-governmental provider of a court information technology system.

Rule 3. Access to Case Records.

- (a) Unless the Access Level is restricted or limited under Rules 4, 5, 7, or 13 below, all Case Records are Fully Accessible to all Access User Groups.
- (b) Access to Administrative Records is not addressed by nor governed by these rules.
- (c) No Custodian may restrict access nor allow greater access than provided under these rules or as otherwise provided by law.

Rule 4. Restricted Access to Case Records.

- (a) The Wyoming Supreme Court shall maintain the *Access Security Matrix* and publish it on the Wyoming Judicial Branch website.
- (b) The restrictions identified in the *Access Security Matrix* shall apply to Archived, Electronic, and Paper Case Records.
- (c) Case Records excluded or restricted from Full Access under federal or state statute but not addressed in the *Access Security Matrix* shall be excluded or restricted from Full Access in accordance with such laws.
- (d) Access to Case Records may be further restricted by a court order entered in accordance with Rule 5.

Rule 5. Requests to Further Restrict Access to Case Records.

- (a) A Case Record made accessible to an Access User Group may be restricted from access by order of a court having jurisdiction over the record upon the following findings:

- (1) The Case Record should be restricted from access by an Access User Group under these rules; or
 - (2) Access by the Access User Group to all or part of the Case Record would substantially injure the interests of an interested person, and such injury outweighs the restricted entities' right of access.
- (b) In restricting access, the court shall use the least restrictions required to achieve the purposes of these rules and the needs of the requester.
 - (c) A motion to restrict or prohibit access to a Case Record may be made by any party to a case, the individual or entity about whom information is present in the Case Record, or by the court on its own motion. The motion must be filed in the court having jurisdiction over the record.
 - (d) The movant shall give notice to all parties to the case except as prohibited by law. The court may require notice be given by the movant or another party to any individual or entity who is the subject of the information contained in the Case Record at issue.
 - (e) When a motion is made under this Rule, the motion and the Case Record at issue shall be rendered restricted until the court rules on the motion. Once the court rules on the motion, the Custodian shall treat the Case Record in accordance with the court order for access purposes.
 - (f) The movant has the burden of establishing by clear and convincing evidence that restricting access is appropriate under one of the justifications listed by Rule 5(a).

Rule 6. Requests to Access Restricted Case Records.

- (a) A Case Record that is restricted or excluded from access under these rules may be made accessible by order of a court having jurisdiction over the record when the court finds:
 - (1) The Custodian mistakenly excluded the Case Record from access under these rules;
 - (2) Restriction under Rule 5 is no longer appropriate;
 - (3) Parties' whose interest are intended to be protected from the restriction have intentionally waived confidentiality where permitted by law; or
 - (4) Extraordinary circumstances require deviation from the restriction on disclosure in order to serve the public interests without creating harm to those intended to be protected by the restriction.
- (b) A motion to request access to a Case Record may be made by any party to a case, member of the Public, or by the court on its own motion. The motion shall be filed in the court having jurisdiction over the record.
- (c) The movant shall give notice to all parties to the case except as prohibited by law. The court may require the movant to give notice of the motion to any individual or entity who is the subject of the information contained in the Case Record at issue.
- (d) The movant has the burden of establishing by clear and convincing evidence that access is appropriate under one of the justifications listed by Rule 6(a).

Rule 7. Redactions.

- (a) The responsibility for redacting personal data identifiers rests solely with counsel and the persons filing the documents with the court.

- (b) For all documents filed, unless otherwise ordered by the court, the parties shall make redactions to personal data identifiers as follows:
- (1) *Social Security Numbers.* – If an individual’s social security is relevant and may not be fully redacted, redact all but the last 4 digits of that number;
 - (2) *Names of Minor Children.* – If the role of a minor child must be included, only use the initials of that child. This does not include cases where the minor is a party to the case, unless the statutes otherwise require;
 - (3) *Dates of Birth.* – If an individual’s date of birth must be included, redact all but the year of birth;
 - (4) *Financial Account Numbers.* – If a financial account number is relevant and may not be fully redacted, redact all but the last 4 digits of such numbers;
 - (5) *Victim Addresses.* – In criminal cases, redact the address and identity of the victim except for the victim’s county and state of residence; and
 - (6) *Other identifiers.* – The filer shall redact all additional information as required by the Access Security Matrix.
- (c) The above redaction requirements do not apply to the following:
- (1) Documents already made confidential by statute, administrative rule, court rule, or court order;
 - (2) The record of an administrative agency or court proceeding if that record was not subject to the redaction requirement when originally made;
 - (3) Citations; and
 - (4) Audio digital recordings.
- (d) The court may order a document to be filed under seal without redaction. The court may later order that that the document be unsealed or that a redacted version of the document be filed as a public record.
- (e) Each circuit court in the State of Wyoming shall enter an order establishing policies and procedures governing redaction and access to court files and proceedings in cases that involve felony charges brought under Wyoming Statutes Title 6, Chapter 2, Article 3. The order adopted by each court shall be in form of the order attached hereto as **Appendix B.**
- (f) A party filing a redacted filing shall also file an unredacted copy under seal in those cases where the entire personal data identifier listed in Rule 7(a) is required (e.g., charging documents). The unredacted copy filed under seal shall be part of the confidential file. If the redacted and non-redacted documents are not offered for filing contemporaneously, the missing document must be filed or postmarked within one Business Day of the date of original filing.
- (1) In civil cases including divorce proceedings, custody proceedings and other matters necessarily involving information subject to redaction, a party is not required to file nonredacted duplicate pleadings so long as the unredacted identifying information is part of some other confidential file.

- (g) In those cases made confidential by statute, administrative rule, court rule, or court order, it is not necessary to file redact transcripts. In other cases, the responsibility for preparing a redacted copy of the official court transcripts rests solely with the parties and their counsel. The court, clerk, and court reporter/transcriber shall not review the transcript for compliance with these rules. Counsel and parties shall review and, if necessary, file redact transcripts in accordance with the following procedures and requirements.¹
- (1) Once a transcript prepared pursuant to Wyo. Stat. Ann. §§ 5-3-401 to 412 is delivered to the clerk's office for filing, and the court reporter/transcriber has given written notice by email, the electronic filing system, or traditional means to the parties that the transcript is completed, the attorneys in the case (or, where there is a self-represented party, the party) are responsible for reviewing it for all personal data identifiers required by law and these rules to be redacted. Each party or counsel shall give prompt written notice of changes of address, telephone number or email address, if any, to the court reporter and other parties.
 - (2) Within 11 calendar days of the delivery by the court reporter/transcriber of the official transcript to the clerk's office, or longer if the court orders, each party must inform the court reporter, by filing a Notice of Intent to Redact with the clerk, of his or her intent to direct the redaction of personal identifiers from the transcript of the court proceeding. A party is only allowed to request redaction of the personal data identifiers specified in Rule 7(a) herein without further order of the court. If no such notice is filed within the allotted time, the clerk shall assume redaction of the personal data identifiers from the transcript is not necessary, and the record completion process shall proceed without further delay.
 - (3) Within 21 calendar days of the transcript's filing with the clerk, or longer if the court orders, an attorney of record or self-represented party, who has previously filed a Notice of Intent to Redact, must file a Confidential Redaction Request. (See [Appendix A](#) to these rules). A copy of this request must also be submitted simultaneously to the court reporter/transcriber. The request shall include the title of the transcript, the date it was filed, the case number and the items to be redacted, referencing them by page and line number and how they are to be redacted. For example, if a party wanted to redact the Social Security Number 123-45-6789 appearing on page 12, line 9 of the transcript, the Confidential Redaction Request would read: page 12, line 9: Social Security Number 123-45-6789 should be redacted to read xxx-xx-6789.
 - (4) When a Confidential Redaction Request is filed, the court reporter/transcriber must within 31 calendar days from the filing of the transcript with the clerk of court, or longer if the court orders, perform the requested redactions and file a redacted version of the transcript with the clerk of court. The original unredacted transcript shall be retained by the clerk of court in the confidential file. The unredacted transcript may be withdrawn from the office of the clerk of the trial court without an order of that court by pro se parties and by appellate counsel of record. The unredacted transcript shall also be available for transmission to the appellate court.

¹ In providing notice under this rule, the clerk may use the model forms in Appendix I of the Suggested Best Practices for Wyoming Official Court Reporters, available on the Wyoming Professional Court Reporter Association website.

- (5) For all civil transcripts and for all criminal trial transcripts when the case is appealed, court reporters of the district courts and chancery court are required to provide either a key-word index or a PDF electronic file for all parties to assist in redaction efforts. Upon request, court reporters of the district courts shall provide either a key-word index or a PDF electronic file for other criminal transcripts.
- (6) In criminal cases, the prosecutor shall notify the court reporter of any information subject to redaction when that information becomes available. Counsel and the parties have a continuing obligation to inform the court reporter of information subject to redaction throughout the pendency of the case.
- (7) Court reporters shall redact information using the black-out method or other method that retains the same line and page numbers as the unredacted transcript.
- (8) In criminal cases, the prosecutor shall be responsible for ensuring redactions are requested for all mandatory transcripts.

Rule 8. Filing Case Records Restricted from Full Access.

- (a) The filer of a Case Record shall ascertain whether the record is restricted from access under these rules. If the Case Record is restricted from Full Access to any Access User Group, the filer shall include in the caption, prominently displayed, the label “Restricted:” followed by a specific citation to each applicable authority preventing Full Access to any Access User Group. If required by these rules to file both a redacted and unredacted version of the filing, the filer shall include this restricted label in both versions.
- (b) If eFiling a Case Record restricted from Full Access, the filer shall select the access designation in the eFiling system that most closely corresponds to the Access Level defined by the *Access Security Matrix*. And in the eFiling system’s “Note to Clerk” field, the eFiler shall insert the label “Restricted:” followed by a specific citation to each applicable authority preventing Full Access to any Access User Group. Making this notation does not excuse the filer from including this same language in the caption.
- (c) When eFiling both a redacted and unredacted version of a Case Record, the filer shall designate the redacted version as “public” and the unredacted version “sealed” in the electronic filing system unless the Access Security Matrix calls for a more or less restrictive Access Level for the specific Case Record type.

Rule 9. Role of Clerk.

- (a) Though not required to review filings for compliance with these rules, the clerk of court may take the following actions to protect recognized privacy rights and confidentiality interests.
 - (1) Without regard to W.S. § 5-7-103, the clerk may refuse to file Traditional Filings that are obviously not in compliance with these rules.

- (2) EFilings which obviously fail to comply with these rules may be removed from the record by the clerk within (3) Business Days of filing. If the clerk removes an eFiling, the clerk shall enter a docket entry that reads, "Disregard. Filing removed." The clerk shall notify all parties when a filing is removed for failure to obviously comply with these rules. At the discretion of the Judge, filings that are removed from the record and refiled in compliance with these rules may relate back to the date the removed filing was first filed.
- (3) The clerk may change the Access Level designation of filings submitted electronically or traditionally with the obviously incorrect Access Level designation. The clerk does not need the filer's preapproval but should provide the filer with notice of the change. A filer who disagrees with a clerk's change in Access Level designation may file a motion under Rule 5 or 6.
- (4) When these rules require the filer to file both a redacted and unredacted version of a Case Record, but the filer merely files an unredacted version, the clerk may treat the unredacted filing as confidential.

Rule 10. Means of Access.

- (a) Case Records may be accessed in any of the following methods:
 - (1) *Archive Access.* – Access to Archived Case Records is gained by request to the Custodian of the court having jurisdiction over the record. These requests for Archive Access may be oral or written and shall clearly identify each record requested so the Custodian can retrieve the Case Record from Wyoming State Archives without extensive research. These requests shall be made during the court's normal working hours and at a time that does not unreasonably interfere with the court's other business. The Custodian shall respond to the request within a reasonable time by requesting the Archived Case Records from Wyoming State Archives and providing copies of the retrieved records, electronically transmitting the retrieved records, or making the retrieved records available for inspection, if the requester is entitled to access.
 - (2) *Physical Access.* – Access to Paper Case Records is gained by request to the Custodian of the court having jurisdiction over the record. These requests for Physical Access may be oral or written and shall clearly identify each record requested so the Custodian can locate the record without extensive research. These requests shall be made during the court's normal working hours and at a time that does not unreasonably interfere with the court's other business. The Custodian shall respond to the request within a reasonable time by locating the Paper Case Records and making them available for inspection, if the requester is entitled to access.
 - (3) *Terminal Access.* – Access to Electronic Case Records is provided for individual cases at display terminals located in courthouses as determined by the State Court Administrator. The terminals shall provide access to Case Records of all courts irrespective of the venue of the proceeding.
 - (4) *Remote Access.* – When authorized by the Wyoming Judicial Council, a Vendor contracted to provide Remote Access may provide Remote Access to Case Records on its web-based platform.

- (b) Physical files may be removed from the clerk's office only as allowed by U.R.D.C. 303. Otherwise, a Custodian who grants a request to inspect records shall ensure the inspection area is within full view of court personnel and the person inspecting the records does not leave the court facility until the records are returned and examined for completeness.

Rule 11. Time of Access.

- (a) Case Records are available at the following times:
- (1) *Archive Access.* – If a Custodian retrieves Archived Case Records from Wyoming State Archives, the Custodian shall provide access to these records during the court's normal working hours and at a time that does not unreasonably interfere with the court's other business.
 - (2) *Physical Access.* – If a Custodian grants a request for Physical Access, the Custodian shall provide Physical Access during the court's normal working hours and at a time that does not unreasonably interfere with the court's other business.
 - (3) *Terminal Access.* – Access to Case Records via public access terminals shall be available during the court's normal working hours and at a time that does not unreasonably interfere with the court's other business. Terminal Access is subject to scheduled downtimes for system maintenance and unforeseen technical issues.
 - (4) *Remote Access.* – When authorized by the Supreme Court, a Vendor contracted to provide Remote Access shall provide such access at all times, subject to publicly scheduled downtimes for system maintenance, and outages for unforeseen technical issues.

Rule 12. Fees for Access.

- (a) Case Records are available for the following fees:
- (1) *Archive Access.* – There is no fee to inspect Archived Case Records retrieved by the Custodian at the appropriate courthouse during normal working hours. Though there is no fee to inspect records at the courthouse, the Custodian shall charge the applicable fees set by rule for copies and electronic transmission of Case Records. These fees shall be paid in advance of production or transmission.
 - (2) *Physical Access.* – There is no fee to inspect Case Records at the appropriate courthouse during normal working hours. Though there is no fee to inspect records at the courthouse, the Custodian shall charge the applicable fees set by rule for copies and electronic transmission of Case Records. These fees shall be paid in advance of production or transmission.
 - (3) *Terminal Access.* – There is no fee to view Case Records via public access terminals. Though there is no fee to view records via public access terminals, the Custodian shall charge the applicable fees set by rule for copies and electronic transmission of Case Records. These fees shall be paid in advance of production or transmission.
 - (4) *Remote Access.* – When authorized by the Wyoming Judicial Council, a Vendor contracted to provide Remote Access may charge fees for Remote Access at rates not exceeding those fixed by contract between the Vendor and Wyoming Judicial Council.

Rule 13. Access to Admitted Exhibits.

- (a) Except where access is restricted by these rules or court order, Standard Exhibits admitted into evidence in a proceeding that is open to the Public shall be available for public inspection under such conditions as the presiding Judge may deem appropriate to safeguard the security of the evidence and integrity of the proceeding.
- (b) A requester seeking access to a Standard Exhibit admitted into evidence should direct the request in writing to the chambers of the Judge who is assigned to the matter, identifying the matter as to which materials are sought, and the specific admitted Standard Exhibit the requester is seeking. The presiding Judge shall direct judicial staff to make the Standard Exhibit available for public inspection under such conditions as the Judge sets to protect the security of the evidence and integrity of the proceeding.
- (c) The scope of this rule is as follows:
 - (1) Standard Exhibits admitted into evidence in a proceeding that is open to the Public are available for public inspection as provided by this rule.
 - (2) Physical Exhibits admitted at trial or hearing are not available under this rule. But copies of photographs of Physical Exhibits submitted under U.R.D.C. 903 in an open proceeding are available under this rule.
 - (3) Sensitive and Bulky Exhibits are not available under these rules. But copies of photographs of Sensitive and Bulky Exhibits submitted under U.R.D.C. 903 in an open proceeding are available under this rule.
 - (4) Admitted exhibits returned or destroyed by the court under U.R.D.C. 903 are not within the court's custody and are not available under these rules.
 - (5) Unadmitted trial exhibits are not within the court's custody and are not available under these rules.
 - (6) Exhibits that are submitted in support of or in opposition to a motion or pleading and that are not admitted at trial or hearing are accessible as provided by the other provisions of these rules.

Rule 14. Bulk Distribution.

Requests for Bulk Distribution are governed by the Wyoming Rules Governing Access to Court Data.

Rule 15. Compiled Information.

Requests for Compiled Information are governed by the Wyoming Rules Governing Access to Court Data.

Rule 16. Failure to comply.

When an attorney fails to comply with these rules, the court having jurisdiction over the record may impose monetary or other sanctions against the attorney.

Rule 17. Local Rules.

A local court may not adopt more restrictive rules or otherwise restrict access beyond that provided for in these rules, nor provide greater access than that provided for in these rules.

Rule 18. Commission on Judicial Conduct and Ethics.

The Commission on Judicial Conduct and Ethics shall have Full Access to Case Records relevant to a confidential investigation or proceeding conducted under Wyo. Const. Art. 5, § 6 and the *Rules Governing the Commission on Judicial Conduct and Ethics*.

Rule 19. Forms.

Notated forms shall be found in the Appendix of Forms.

Rule 20. Effective Date.

These rules shall take effect and be in force from and after the **DATE**.

UNIFORM ORDER REGARDING FILING AND PROCESSING OF SEXUAL ASSAULT CASES

WHEREAS, the Wyoming Supreme Court has had occasion to address the processes and procedures to be followed when felony sexual assault cases are initiated in the Circuit Courts of the State of Wyoming under Wyoming Statutes Title 6, Chapter 2, Article 3; and

WHEREAS the Conference of the Circuit Courts of the State of Wyoming passed a Resolution encouraging all Circuit Courts to adopt a written policy addressing the processes and procedures to be used in the filing of felony sexual assault cases under Wyoming Statutes Title 6, Chapter 2, Article 3 so as to ensure compliance with Wyoming Statute § 6-2-319; and

WHEREAS, the Circuit Courts are directed, by Rule 5.1 of the Rules Governing Redactions from Court Records, to establish a uniform written policy addressing the processes and procedures to be used in the filing of felony sexual assault cases under Wyoming Statutes Title 6, Chapter 2, Article 3;

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED AND DECREED as follows:

1. The Court's "redacted" file and the proceedings on felony sexual assault cases shall remain open to the public.
2. Attorneys and officers filing documents in cases covered by this rule shall be responsible for providing redacted and un-redacted versions of those documents to the Court at the time of filing. The redacted filings shall reference the accused and the purported victim(s) by initials only. In addition, any other information that might identify the accused or the purported victim(s) shall also be redacted. The Clerk of Court shall examine the redacted documents to ensure compliance.
3. The name of the accused may be released to aid in the arrest of the accused.
4. If any party feels there is a need for proceedings to be closed to the public in a particular felony sexual assault case, a hearing on that motion shall be held in open court so as to allow the public to attend and to be heard on the issue of the proposed closed proceedings. No hearings shall be closed unless and until the Court makes a finding that a compelling interest exists that would justify closed proceedings.

5. If a member of the public asks a Circuit Court employee to provide access to a case file involving a particular defendant, the Circuit Court employee shall ask the requesting party to also identify the nature of the case sought. If the requesting party indicates that the case involves sexual assault and provides satisfactory identifying information, then the Circuit Court employee can provide the redacted file. This procedure is intended to prevent the Circuit Court employee from acknowledging the existence of felony sexual assault charges based solely on the name of the accused.
6. Cases involving felony sexual assault charges shall be marked “sealed” in the Court’s docket management system until such time as the case is bound over to the District Court. This procedure is intended to ensure that the name of the accused does not appear on publicly accessed terminals until such time as the case has been bound over to the District Court.

Attachment S

Permanent Forms Committee

Purpose

The purpose of the Permanent Forms Committee is to create, revise, and maintain court approved forms for the Wyoming Judicial Branch. The Committee members will develop and manage a uniform bank of court approved forms to be used by Pro Se litigants throughout Wyoming.

Committee Membership, Meetings, and Voting

1. Membership. The Permanent Forms Committee membership will include two circuit court judges; two district court judges; one circuit court chief clerk and one district court clerk each appointed from their respective conferences, and two members of the Wyoming Bar appointed by the Permanent Forms Committee Chair. The State Court Administrator will appoint an employee(s) to staff the Committee.
 - a. Membership terms will be two years. Initial terms will be staggered for the circuit court judges and the district court judges to ensure continuity.
 - b. Members may serve consecutive terms.
 - c. A chair will serve for a two-year term. At the end of the term, a new chair will be elected from the membership. An individual may serve two consecutive terms as chair.
2. Meetings. The Permanent Forms Committee will initially meet monthly for the development of the forms. As the committee transitions to reviewing and updating current forms, the Committee will meet at least quarterly but may meet more frequently as necessary upon the request of a member or upon suggestion of staff. No action of the Committee may be taken without a quorum of the Committee. Five members of the Committee shall constitute a quorum.
3. Voting. Voting shall take place in a meeting of the Committee or via email when the chair deems appropriate.

Roles and Responsibilities

1. The Permanent Forms Committee staff will be responsible for:
 - a. Facilitating Committee meetings as directed by the chair;
 - b. Developing and distributing meeting agendas no later than ten days prior to scheduled Committee meetings;
 - c. Compiling and distributing meeting minutes;
 - d. Monitoring public comment and recommendations for forms and reporting on such to the Committee;
 - e. Managing and archiving all official forms approved by the Committee; and
 - f. Assisting with revising and formatting forms as directed by the Committee.
2. The Permanent Forms Committee members will be responsible for:
 - a. Reviewing information provided in preparation for Committee meetings;
 - b. Communicating Committee decisions to their respective conferences;
 - c. Receiving information and concerns pertaining to forms from their conferences; and
 - d. Presenting Committee recommendations to the Wyoming Judicial Council when necessary.

Attachment T

Circuit Court Audit Committee Structure

Committee Membership, Meeting Frequency and Terms

1. The CCAC membership will include three circuit judges representing small, medium and large courts; two chief clerks from different sized courts; and the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court or a designee.
 - a. The State Court Administrator and Deputy Administrator will be non-voting members.
 - b. The Internal Auditor will staff the committee.
2. The CCAC will meet every six months to review audit findings and determine audit focus areas for the following six months.
 - a. Additional meetings may initially occur as the audit program develops.
 - b. If decisions need to be made between meetings, voting may take place by email.
3. Membership terms will be three years.
 - a. Initial terms will be staggered to ensure continuity.
 - i. Terms will be for one, two and three years for the initial judges.
 - ii. Terms will be for two and three years for the initial chief clerks.
 - b. Members may serve two consecutive terms.
4. Election of a chairman will take place during the first meeting in odd-numbered years.
 - a. The chairman will serve a two-year term.
 - b. If the chairman position is vacated, a new chairman will be elected at the next meeting and will complete the vacated term.
 - c. Members may serve as chairman for two consecutive terms.

Roles and Responsibilities

1. The Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) staff will be responsible for the following:
 - a. Facilitation of meetings;
 - b. Compilation of potential audit topics after discussion with AOC staff, review of help desk tickets, and inquiry of audit committee members;
 - c. Development and distribution of the agenda one week prior to scheduled meetings; and
 - d. Compilation and distribution of meeting minutes.
2. The Circuit Judge and Chief Clerk members will be responsible for the following:
 - a. Review of audit reports and determination of appropriate follow-up actions, if needed;
 - b. Approval of audit focus areas; and
 - c. Notification of potential areas of concern from circuit judge and chief clerk perspective.



- Wyoming Judicial Council and committees, initiatives
 - Access to justice – court navigator
 - More support for judges – admin and time off
 - Children’s Justice Project
 - Treatment courts
 - Mental health diversion

- Efiling, nod to clerks. Case management system- better data, easier access to courts.

Still ahead, in the works

Mental health and substance abuse

- Mental illness, substance abuse disorders and other behavioral health disorders. Nearly 1 in 5 Americans live with mental illness. They are 10 times more likely to be incarcerated than they are to be hospitalized. 70% of incarcerated individuals suffer from serious mental illness, substance abuse, or both. At the end of 2017, 90% of Wyoming’s 2,5000 inmates in the Department of Corrections System required some sort of substance abuse treatment. In 2020, 86% of Wyoming’s inmate population had a behavioral health need.
- But jails are not treatment centers, and they were never intended to be. The unfortunate reality is that the criminal justice system has become a primary referral source, the entry point, to obtain treatment and services.

- Almost all state court dockets have litigants struggling with substance use disorder or mental health challenges: child welfare, guardianships, endangered adults, housing and employment issues.
- Specialty courts keep participants at home, employed, and supporting their families while saving the cost of incarceration and other related home-based support.
- We will continue to expand and improve specialty courts throughout the State, thanks to the legislature's bill that will transfer management of the treatment courts to the judicial branch with implementation July of 2024.
- Mental Health Diversion. Same principle as treatment courts, but diverting people charged with non-violent offenses prior to, or early in, the justice process. Saves money and puts resources to work at improving their lives and becoming contributing members of society instead of simply incarcerating them. To begin pilot program in Campbell County early 2024.

Constantly improving technology so Wyoming citizens have access to courts

- A well-functioning court system is always evolving to improve access to justice, to adapt to changing needs, and to take advantage of new tools to make case processing more efficient and effective.
- Meeting those needs includes using court technology and procedures implemented during the pandemic. During the pandemic, state courts expanded their reliance on virtual hearings, e-filing, other support to make it easier for litigants. We will continue with those advances.

Improved access to justice

- Work on interactive forms for self-represented litigants.
- Unmet legal needs in rural areas – undermine access to justice, undermining many Wyoming citizens' ability to obtain legal representation and making it increasingly difficult for courts to fairly and timely process cases.

Our big ask for the 2024 session

Adequate support for services provided to Wyoming citizens

The Wyoming Judicial Branch has prided itself on its austerity budget, and historically, when courts were places where parties appeared with lawyers and judges called balls and strikes, that may have worked. Courts today are much more than that. They provide a variety of services to Wyoming citizens far beyond the traditional court model. Many parties are self-represented, thus requiring more court services and more judge time. There are more domestic cases, which tend to continue for longer periods of time. There are many more people with mental illness, more commitment proceedings, and greater delays in criminal proceedings involving mentally ill defendants. Our 55 judges, many of whom have been on the bench only a short time, must be provided with meaningful and useful judicial education. As with any organization, complying with federal and state laws governing employment takes more time. Today's judicial branch must provide far more complex services, and that takes staff. Those complex services are often borne by the Judge, but only because the Judiciary has not adapted to the new normal. A healthy Judiciary requires resources to adapt to a changing society so Judges can be, primarily, Judges, and the complexity of providing excellent service to the people of Wyoming can be borne by court administration staff, clerks, and chambers' staff.

At the heart of court operations are the judges and employee who show their commitment to providing a modern, well-run judiciary through their initiative, innovation, and service.

When the court system consists of a robust and strong workforce, creative programs and initiatives can grow. These programs and initiatives

provide better court services to all Wyoming citizens, and we will continue to strive to improve the judicial system for all.

That's why we are requesting 10 additional administrative staff positions, and 9 new circuit court clerk positions.

AOC Position Descriptions

- Grant Writer
 - Research, write, and manage grant opportunities to increase availability of funding.
 - Potential grant opportunities include State Justice Institute grants, Bureau of Justice Assistance grants, possible FEMA grants, Department of Homeland Security grants, etc.
- 2 Applications positions
 - Assist with project management for the Applications Division to ensure appropriate follow up on action items and projects. The Applications Division provides implementation and support for all software applications statewide used by the courts requiring substantial oversight to ensure implementation and follow up on software projects are progressing appropriately.
 - Would provide increased support for Judicial Branch software applications, including decreased time for help desk responses related to software applications, and increased focus on making the applications work for the Branch, i.e., better reports to assist with docket management.
- HR employee – onboarding/offboarding
 - Assist with the day-to-day tasks of human resources – onboarding, offboarding, insurance, leave, payroll, etc.
 - This position would free up time for the HR Manager to focus on the priorities of the Branch, including developing a secondary trauma and well-being program, creating a

mentorship program for new employees (and Judges, if desired), assisting with an employee onboarding program.

- Public Information Officer
 - Provide strategic guidance for the Branch to increase public knowledge about the Judiciary.
 - Develop informational resources for other branches of government, act as a primary point of contact for the media both statewide and on a local level when needed and desired, assist in educating the public about the Judicial Learning Center, plan and implement outreach strategies such as You Be the Judge and Law Day activities.
- Education Coordinator
 - Coordinate activities and trainings for the Education Division freeing up time for the Chief Education Officer to focus on creating a cohesive plan to education for the Branch.
 - Assist in creating online content for the Learning Management System.
- Behavioral Health Services
 - Oversee behavioral health projects for the Branch, including treatment courts and diversion program.
- Court Services
 - Assist the courts with daily administrative tasks such as jury management, assistance and advice on day-to-day court practices and processes for clerks' offices, information on changes to court rules and statutory changes that affect courts and assistance with implementation of those changes, providing communication and collaboration between court jurisdictions and county offices when necessary.
 - Assist courts with day-to-day public contacts; act as a liaison to the county commissioners in each location to streamline security, building issues, etc.

- Court Navigator
 - o Provide support and oversight for court navigator program – both pilot and during expansion.
 - o Ensure that court navigators are appropriately trained and supported to provide services to self-represented litigants who use the court navigator program.
- Chief Information Officer
 - o Oversee the three arms of technology – IT, software applications, and data.
 - o Work with ETS to identify places where different branches of government can collaborate on technology needs.
 - o Creates a more cohesive approach to technology for the Branch.

The increased demands on the courts due to the changing nature of the Judiciary is also evident in the need for additional resources at the clerk level. The most recent circuit court workload study indicates a need for additional clerk positions to ensure that litigants who come into contact with the “people’s court” in Wyoming receive the service they expect and deserve. The rise in self-represented litigants means more time dedicated to litigants at the courthouse counters. The increased use of technology expands access to justice statewide – providing convenience to litigants and attorneys alike. But that technology creates an additional administrative burden on the clerks that is substantial:

- Increased complexity in scheduling court hearings due to remote participation options;
- Increased time spent with litigants to ensure proper use of videoconference technology for remote hearings and testing when necessary;
- Use of remote interpretation software requiring set up within applications and remote support for litigants and interpreters;
- Use of jury management system provides convenience to jurors allowing for online completion of jury questionnaire, but the creation

and management of jury pools is more time consuming due to the processes involved and the assistance provided to those without computers or computer skills.

Attachment V

Participation in Legislative Committees

This policy shall govern judicial officer and Administrative Office of the Courts staff participation on legislative committees.

1. Judicial officers and AOC staff shall only participate in legislative committees as non-voting members.
2. Judicial officers and AOC staff can share their knowledge and experience, but shall not participate in making policy decisions.
3. The Wyoming Judicial Council must approve any judicial officer or AOC staff member sitting on a legislative committee.

FCE and Private PASS Chambers/WSC Role Proposal

Anyone with access to the Public Access terminals or who have access to the Wyoming Judicial Branch (WJB) network (at Court locations or via the WJB VPN) will have the ability to look up any non-confidential case information via Public PASS. The following are additional permissions that would be allowed for these groups to use in the case management system, FullCourt Enterprise (FCE), or another application called Private PASS that grants access to additional confidential information.

It is general IT best practice to allow only the minimal permissions necessary to perform one's job duties. Utilizing this philosophy, this proposal is put before you for your review and approval.

Circuit Court Judges – Access to confidential information in all Circuit Courts, and access to all non-confidential information in all District Courts for Criminal Case types only (no Juvenile types or Civil Case types). Additional permissions within FCE for Judge Notes, Judge Appointments, Hearings, Search Warrant information, Image Annotations, Reports, Document Templates, and Reminders are granted in each Judge's "Home" Court.

This request for Circuit Court Judges to have access to non-confidential District Court Criminal case information was made to allow Judges to gain a better understanding of the case history of those appearing in their courts for criminal offenses. With this permission in the Private PASS system, Judges will be able to search across the State in both Circuit and District Jurisdictions to access a more complete Criminal History for a given individual.

District Court Judges – Access to confidential information in all District and Chancery Courts, and access to all non-confidential information in all Circuit Courts for Criminal Case types only (no Civil Case types). Additional permissions within FCE for Judge Notes, Judge Appointments, Hearings, Search Warrant information, Image Annotations, Reports, Document Templates, and Reminders are granted in each Judge's "Home" Court.

This request for District Court Judges to have access to Circuit Court Criminal case information was made to allow Judges to gain a better understanding of the case history of those appearing in their courts for criminal offenses. With this permission in the Private PASS system Judges will be able to search across the State in both Circuit and District Jurisdictions to access a more complete Criminal History for a given individual.

Chancery Court Judges – Access to confidential information in all District and Chancery Courts. Additional permissions within FCE for Judge Notes, Judge Appointments, Hearings, Search Warrant information, Image Annotations, Reports, Document Templates, and Reminders are granted in each Judge's "Home" Court.

District and Chancery Court Chambers Staff (Judicial Assistants, Law Clerks/Staff Attorneys, Court Reporters) – Access to confidential information in their "Home" District Court, and access to all non-confidential information in all District Courts. Upon request, and in coordination with the District Court Clerk, Chambers Staff permissions can be elevated to the same as a District Court Judge in a non-"Home" Court. Additional permissions within FCE for Judge Notes, Judge Appointments, Hearings, Search Warrant information, Image Annotations, Reports, Document Templates, and Reminders are granted in each Chamber Staff's "Home" Court.

The current process of putting in a Help Desk ticket to have permissions for Chambers Staff elevated in another court has been in place for a number of years. A request is entered, and Administration staff contacts the District Court

Clerk to ensure all stakeholders are informed of the need of elevated permissions to access confidential information in the Court. These elevated permissions allow the Chambers staff to better assist their Judge who has been assigned a case in the Court where permissions are being sought. The Technology Committee is recommending no changes to this practice.

Supreme Court Justices – Access to confidential information in all District, Chancery, and Circuit Courts.

Supreme Court Chambers Staff (Judicial Assistants, Staff Attorneys) – Access to confidential information in all District, Chancery, and Circuit Courts.

Supreme Court Chambers Staff have a frequent need to access cases in the Courts to perform research for the cases appearing in the Supreme Court. Many of these cases originate in those Courts, and access to all the cases, including confidential information, allows the Supreme Court Chambers staff to better assist the Justices.

Supreme Court Clerks – Access to confidential information in all District, Chancery, and Circuit Courts.

The Supreme Court Clerk's office phone number is often the first point of contact for requests for information regarding cases in Wyoming Courts. In order to direct the caller to the correct court for information, the Supreme Court Clerk's office searches for cases across all the different court databases. Being able to utilize Private PASS with access to confidential cases would enable the clerk's office to quickly assist the caller in getting connected with the correct court. Access to confidential cases also assists in preparing cases on appeal.

Circuit, Chancery, and District Court Clerks – Various Role levels within their own “Home” Court and access to non-confidential information in all the courts.

I. PURPOSE

This policy establishes a comprehensive set of hardware and software standards for all employees within the Wyoming Judicial Branch (WJB), based on their respective job roles.

II. DEFINITIONS

A. As used in this policy:

1. “Standard Hardware Package” means standard keyboard, mouse, headset, web camera and speakers. External CD drive will be provided upon request.
2. “Standard Software Package” means Microsoft 365 (including a courts.state.wy.us email address), Adobe Acrobat DC, Liberty Player, Virtual Private Network (VPN) client (if approved by employee’s supervisor). This list does not include anti-virus or other security products as deemed necessary by the IT Division.

III. APPLICATION

- A. This policy applies to all WJB employees and limited software for county employees working with the courts, i.e. District Court Clerks or other outside agencies or contractors. Any other use cases to be approved by the State Court Administrator.
- B. All existing equipment and software will be grandfathered, excluding subscription-based software. Should the equipment or software malfunction or necessitate renewal and falls outside the specifications outlined in this policy, it will not be renewed or replaced.

- C. Liberty Recording Software will be provided to all Circuit Court courtroom computers. Upon request, Liberty recording, associated hardware and licensing costs can be provided to a District Court courtroom; paid for from local court budget.
- D. Software not listed or provided by the IT Division is not supported by the IT Division.
- E. Additional equipment (monitors, keyboard, mouse, docking station etc.) will be provided to those locations where there is not a permanent Judge.
- F. Monthly service fees associated with iPads or smartphone will be paid from local court budget.
- G. This policy only covers hardware and software for end-users. It does not include networking infrastructure or courtroom technology.
- H. This standard does not cover printers or copy machines. Requests for additional printers or copy machines will be approved based on location and need, as determined by the State Court Administrator and the Technology committee as appropriate.
