## UNIFORM ORDER ON VIOLATIONS OF THE LARAMIE COUNTY 24/7 SOBRIETY PROGRAM

**THE ABOVE-ENTITLED MATTER** having come before the Circuit Court of Laramie County, *Sua Sponte*, in continuing efforts to create standard and effective policies regarding the implementation and operation of the Laramie County 24/7 Sobriety Program created pursuant to W.S.§ 7-13-1701 et seq.

The Laramie County 24/7 Sobriety Program (hereinafter 24/7 Program) shall report any violations of the program rules to the Laramie County District Attorney's Office (hereinafter District Attorney's Office) with a copy of the violation to the appropriate court. The District Attorney's Office will then determine whether to seek revocation or modification of bond/probation. The District Attorney's Office may seek revocation of bond/probation for any violations, regardless of whether the Defendant has been released pursuant to this order.

If the Defendant is being held pursuant to an arrest warrant this uniform order does <u>not</u> apply.

In the event any Defendant is taken into custody <u>without a warrant</u> for a violation of the 24/7 Program rules pursuant to W.S. §7-13-1709:

First Violation of 24/7 Program: If the District Attorney's Office has not placed a hold on the Defendant after twelve (12) hours then the Defendant can be released on to their prior bond/probation conditions, upon testing 0.00 BAC and after being brought before the judge. The Defendant must continue to follow and abide by all previous court-ordered conditions including participation in the 24/7 Program.

Second Violation of 24/7 Program: If the District Attorney's Office has not placed a hold on the Defendant after twenty-four (24) hours, then the Defendant can be released on their prior bond/probation conditions, upon testing 0.00 BAC and after being brought before the judge. The Defendant must continue to follow and abide by all previous court-ordered conditions including participation in the 24/7 Program.

Third or Subsequent Violation of 24/7 Program: The Defendant shall remain in custody pursuant to W.S. § 7-13-1709 until they can be seen by a judge.

If the District Attorney's Office places a hold on a Defendant for any level of violation, the District Attorney's Office shall file necessary revocation/modification paperwork for the Defendant by the following business day. The Defendant shall be held in custody until seen by a judge.
